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EIGHTEENTH BIENNIAL REPORT OF THE MICHIGAN STATE
BOARD OF FISH COMMISSIONERS.

To His Excellency, the Governor:

We herewith submit a biennial report of the work of the State Board of Fish Commissioners from July 1, 1906, to June 30, 1908, including a report from the Superintendent, to which attention is specially invited.

The Board again calls attention to the complicated condition of our fish laws and expresses the hope that some effort will be made to put them in better shape. The construction of large dams in the streams of our state attracts attention to the question of fish ladders or chutes. If such can be constructed so as to work properly, the necessity for them is obvious. As to whether or not a practical fish ladder can be constructed in a thirty foot dam is a serious question which cannot be determined with any degree of satisfaction without a most careful investigation. The Board has for the past few months been investigating the subject as well as it could do so by correspondence, but it is convinced that it should not take the responsibility of recommending fish ladders in or over high dams from its present knowledge.

We desire to call attention to the law passed by the last Legislature with reference to the closed season for speckled trout, land-locked salmon, grayling, California trout, lochleven trout or steel head trout. Before the passage of this act, the open season was from May 1st to September 1st. The act changed it from April 15th to August 15th. The Board has no accurate knowledge of the cause of the change, but it thinks that it was because of the earlier spawning season in the Upper Peninsula, where the waters become cold earlier in the season. Applied to the Lower Peninsula, we think the act produced an injurious change. The warm days in April bring the fish out of their semi-dormant state and they are ready to eat anything, and are therefore captured in large numbers. At that time they are soft and unfit for food. It is said that after the 15th of August they are heavy with spawn. It is true, but it is also true that they are very sluggish, slow to rise to a fly and slow to take bait as compared with the earlier days of spring. It is undoubtedly true that not twenty-five per cent of the number taken from the 15th of April to the 15th of May can be taken from the 15th of August to the 15th of September. It would therefore seem perfectly apparent that the depletion of fish must be very much greater in the early spring days than in the late summer days. The larger number taken in the spring would, if allowed to remain until after the 15th of May, likewise carry spawn in the late summer days when they are less liable to be taken. The best time for the open season in the Lower Peninsula would be from May 15th to September 1st, but if a longer season is thought desirable, it would be far better to extend it to September 15th than to open it earlier than May 15th; but it should be closed at least as early as September 1st in the Upper Peninsula, and should not be opened there earlier than May 1st.

It has been the constant aim of the Board to so stock our inland lakes and streams that they may produce a reasonable amount of food fishes for those who live around them, or others who desire to go there for them. To produce this result it is not only necessary to propagate and plant these waters, but to make reasonable protection to the fish after they are so planted.

The work of artificial propagation of fish is becoming understood and appreciated. This is shown by the constantly increasing number of applications for planting which come from all parts of the State. These applications are increasing more rapidly than our facilities for filling them. It would, however, take but a slight increase in our current appropriations and a moderate increase in special appropriations for a few years to enable the state to meet all demands upon it for fish planting. The increase and growth of the work of the Board was set out with considerable detail in our sixteenth and seventeenth biennial reports, covering the years 1903 to 1906, inclusive, to which we refer for general information upon the subject.

As is well known, the work of planting commercial fish in the Great Lakes has been left to the Federal authorities for the past eleven or twelve years, and the work of the State has been confined to its inland waters. This has been to the manifest advantage of the State, and we think is undoubtedly the true policy.

Our estimates for the ensuing biennial period have been made on a strictly business basis, and the amount asked for is that which will produce the best results in a most economical manner. The Board does not believe it to be a part of its duty to lobby for appropriations, but simply to lay before the Governor and the Legislature the facts as they understand them to be. There their responsibility in the matter of appropriations ends.

Of course they are willing and glad to explain any items in the estimates or any other matter connected with their administration at any time when called upon.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT.

State Board of Fish Commissioners, Detroit, Michigan:

Gentlemen—I submit herewith a general report on the hatching and distribution of fish during the seasons 1907 and 1908, also the repairs and improvements during the same years, with recommendations for the ensuing biennial period. Some other matters in connection with the work of the Board are also touched upon.

First of all, it seems necessary to again call attention to the fact that it is a physical impossibility to supply the demand for fish with our present facilities for producing them. For a number of years the applications have annually run into the thousands, and they are constantly increasing. Fifteen or twenty years ago requests for fish for inland waters were confined almost wholly to brook trout, wall-eyed pike and German carp, with an occasional call for bass, perch, lake trout, rainbow trout, eels and grayling. Incidentally it may be stated that so far as hatcheries are concerned, German carp have fallen into disrepute and went into the discard about a dozen years ago. Eels likewise, though there is still some inquiry for them, have not been produced for more than fifteen years, for the reason that they are not generally regarded in high favor and are known to be destructive of other fish.

But calls for brook trout and black bass in particular have increased enormously; first it was a sprinkle, then a downpour and now a deluge. There is also a fast growing demand for perch and bluegills, and considerable inquiry for grass-pike, muskallunge, strawberry bass, and in fact practically all of our common food fishes. Pleas for larger shipments of bass and trout are more and more frequent and urgent, but we are compelled to diminish rather than increase the number of fish shipped to each person, and to carry forward many bass and other applications from year to year. An average of one new pond added yearly to each of our bass hatcheries helps some, but still leaves us away behind with our orders.

Applications for fish for private waters are quite frequently received, but no fish are knowingly furnished for waters other than those that are public in a fishing sense. I have always construed the term "public waters" as meaning any lake, pond, stream or river in which lawful fishing by the public is permitted, regardless of the ownership of underlying or bordering lands.

The logical and economical expansion of the producing facilities so urgently needed should for the most part be made at the hatching plants already established. The Mill Creek plant should be developed to the limit of the adjoining valley lands that are available for ponds. The output of bass and perch at this station may thus be multiplied at least three-fold, and with an increased operating expense of not to exceed 50 per cent. The same is true even to a greater extent of Drayton Plains, as there is a greater acreage available for pond development. The hatching of wall-eyed pike, perch and bluegills should also be taken up at this station. The full development of the available ground at Paris will enable us to increase our annual production of rainbow trout sufficient to meet all demands for these fish for many years to come. The production of brook trout at the Harrietta Sta-

tion may be increased at least four-fold, as there is an ample flow of spring water and sufficient ground room for ponds to do so. The development to the limit of our opportunities as indicated for the four hatching stations above noted is urgently recommended. We would then be fairly comfortable as compared with the present situation with respect to meeting the demand for black bass, brook trout, rainbow trout, wall-eyed pike and blue-gills for Lower Peninsula waters. To properly take care of the demand above the Straits a large and well-equipped hatching and pond plant is urgently needed in addition to our present hatchery at the Soo. Improvements by the Government at the latter point make the future of this station quite uncertain, and it is probably only a question of time when this hatchery will have to be moved or abandoned.

The plan recommended in my report of two years ago—transferring the brood stock of brook trout from Paris to the trout hatchery at Harrietta and devoting the Paris ponds entirely to the production of rainbow trout—was recently carried out, and is unquestionably a move in the right direction. The reasons for making this change were given in detail in that report, but may again be referred to briefly.

One of the three creeks comprising the water supply at Paris, the Little Buckhorn, rises wholly on State lands, and now has an independent connection with both hatcheries, as urgently recommended in my last report. Its flow is ample to run both hatcheries to their limit, while the temperature and quality leave nothing to be desired for hatching any kind of trout. But a much larger flow is required for the ponds, so the other streams, the Cheney and Big Buckhorn, must be drawn upon. These two creeks originate a mile or more above the ponds and hence are warmer in the summer and also receive much surface water at times. In spite of the utmost efforts and painstaking care, it became more and more difficult to carry adult brook trout in this water. A game but losing fight was made. The production of spawn continued to decrease from year to year.

Rainbow trout, however, are more hardy, and thrive best in a somewhat higher temperature. The loss of the brood stock at Paris is merely nominal, the stock is accumulating rapidly and nearly fills the ponds to their capacity. The output jumped from less than 400,000 in 1907 to over 1,000,000 in 1908, and present indications are that the production of 1909 will be upwards of 2,000,000. With the development of additional hatching ponds below the present series and also in the gorge of the Big Buckhorn, this station may easily be made the greatest rainbow trout establishment in the United States.

There is some unwarranted opposition to the introduction of rainbow trout. It is true, however, that they should never under any circumstances be introduced into cold brook trout streams. Such waters are not the most congenial for rainbows any way, but to the extent that they thrive there they necessarily diminish the production of brook trout. But the middle or lower waters of many of our larger streams that were once suitable for brook trout are no longer so. Such waters, or those that are midway between what might be termed brook trout and bass waters, are admirably suited for rainbows. The claim that the latter have driven the brook trout from such territory is not in most cases well-founded. Changes of temperature and other conditions that have made such waters wholly congenial for rainbows have at the same time made them unsuitable for brook trout. The destruction of forests changes the complexion of the water courses flowing through them and drives the brook trout nearer and nearer toward

the headwaters. The middle and lower waters of such rivers as the Boardman and Pere Marquette are striking examples of the changes referred to.

In proportion to the number planted in inland waters, no species have responded with such generous results as the rainbow and steelhead trout, which for practical purposes may be regarded as the same fish. A five-pound rainbow no longer attracts special attention; an eight or ten-pounder may be noticed by the local papers; and a specimen twelve pounds and upwards is not at all certain of calling out a press dispatch. At the present time there is a mounted rainbow trout in Detroit that weighed sixteen pounds when caught. It was taken from the St. Mary's River in the summer of 1907.

The output of brook trout shows but little increase over that of the preceding biennial term. The production from the Paris ponds continued to shrink, as heretofore explained, and we were unable to procure as many eyed eggs as usual from private sources for the distribution of 1908.

The collection of brook trout eggs from pond stock at Harrietta in the fall of 1908 increased about 1,200,000 over the preceding season. Between 600,000 and 700,000 of this increase is to be credited to the station, the remainder being taken from pond stock transferred from Paris during the summer.

So much has been said in previous reports concerning the character and volume of the water supply at Harrietta that it seems quite unnecessary to again refer to it. It is sufficient to say that the development of facilities to fully utilize the magnificent flow of spring water on the premises, over 3,000 gallons per minute, will enable us to produce from 10,000,000 to 15,000,000 of trout eggs annually, making this station rank with the largest brook trout hatcheries in the world.

There was a very marked and gratifying increase in the output of bass from both Mill Creek and Drayton Plains stations, amounting in the biennial period to over one million. For the first time in their history, Mill Creek passed the million mark in 1908, and Drayton Plains the half-million. The production at Mill Creek the past season, 1,260,000, has never been equalled at any bass hatchery in the U. S. in a single season.

An account of some recent experiments made by Mr. Lydell, who is conceded to be the most successful bass culturist in this country, was reported by him as follows:

EXPERIMENT NO. 1.

"Owing to the large loss of eggs and fry of the small-mouthed bass at this station in former years, caused principally by the sudden changes in temperature in the ponds at spawning season, it was deemed advisable to try to carry or hold the breeding bass beyond the time when these sudden changes are apt to occur. Therefore, in the fall of 1907, pond "X"—one of the deepest ponds at the station—was selected as a storage pond, and all small-mouthed breeders at the station were placed therein. A very generous supply of minnows was also placed in this pond. In the spring of 1908 more minnows were added and a generous supply of water was allowed to flow through the pond, keeping it as cool as possible. The breeding ponds were prepared, beds put in place, and everything placed in readiness for the breeding fish. They were held in "X" pond until May 11th, when it was found by examining a few of the breeders that they could not be held with safety any longer, and they were therefore sorted and placed in the spawning ponds in the afternoon of this date. During the afternoon of the

next day following it was discovered that nearly every nest had been spawned on, and every nest produced fry, anywhere from five to ten thousand. No bad results appeared to have been caused by the holding back of the spawning operations.

"This experiment, although very successful this one year, may not prove so flattering the coming season. Therefore not until another year's experimenting along these lines has been gone through will we be able to say positively that this is a wise thing to do. More breeders have been added to the stock, another storage pond has been provided, and all the breeders are at this writing confined therein, with the intention of keeping them there until the weather has settled in the month of May, and they can be assured of carrying on their spawning operations in a temperature that is most delightful and pleasing to the parent bass, and more than gratifying to the fish culturist.

EXPERIMENT NO. 2.

"A great deal of thought has been given to separating the adult small-mouth bass from the fry in spawning ponds after the latter have risen from the nest. Mr. Otis Monroe, foreman of this station, advanced an idea in the spring of 1908 that looked very feasible and practical.

"Pond No. 5 was selected for this work. A poultry netting of one inch mesh was set around the entire pond about twenty feet from the shore, forming as it were a pond within a pond. The adult bass were placed in the inside enclosure with their nests set directly against the wire fence. This fence extended from the bottom of the pond to about eight inches above the water level. Every outlet was closed so that the adult bass could not get ashore. When the fry were at the stage when the parent fish ceased his parental duties, they would pass through the wire to the outside pond safe from the cannibalistic nature of the adult fish.

"This experiment was a decided success as far as separating the adult fish from the fry, but unlooked for obstacles arose. The shallow part of the pond had become in the meantime alive with tadpoles, water beetles, etc., which had been feeding upon the daphne and other water mites that should have been food for the bass. Therefore the fry did not grow as we expected. With an open pond the adult bass devour all of these obnoxious forms of life and the food for the young bass is left for them alone, so no doubt as good results will be obtained by letting the old bass mingle freely with the fry, and if they are well fed they will not disturb the fry to any extent until the latter arrive at the fingerling stage. Then, of course, they are taken out and shipped.

PERCH EXPERIMENTS.

"In February, 1907, we secured one hundred and twelve breeding perch from the Saginaw River and placed them in pond No. 5. In the month of April brush was placed in the pond around the shores, for the perch to spawn in, as they enter the brush and spawn mostly in the night, and hang their spawn or ribbons on this brush. Every night this spawn was gathered up and placed in the hatchery in jars, the same as with the whitefish. The eggs being in a ribbon-like mass, it was not very successful. They were all right until the third or fourth day when they arose to the surface of the jar and flowed over into the tanks unless some one was constantly on hand to keep them stirred with a feather. Extra screens that fitted down into the jar about three inches from the top were provided and worked remarkably

well until the young fry commenced to come out. At this stage the eggs had become like a mass of jelly, and the young fish, if hatched near the bottom of the jar, would swim up and become tangled in this gelatine mass and there died. If the screen was taken away, the whole mass would rise up and flow out into the tank. So many of the fry were becoming stranded on their way to the surface that it was deemed advisable to liberate the whole lot, so the jars were taken down and the eggs, fish and all, were dumped into the fry tanks. After turning the eggs into the tanks they were moved about every hour by taking a scap and moving it slowly through the water. This created a current and raised the eggs from the bottom of the tanks when if left they would settle in one place and the eggs and fry smother.

"This way of hatching perch, although quite successful, was not very satisfactory, as it took too much attention, and if handled in large numbers would necessitate having a large force of men constantly on hand to give them the required amount of attention to insure hatching. From these 112 perch we were successful in shipping 1,220,000 fry and 18,200 Number One fingerlings. These fingerlings were raised in the ponds at the station.

"In the year 1908 the Commission wished this work increased, so in February of this year five hundred more breeders were secured from the Saginaw River. These were placed in ponds No. 2 and No. 4, and those in pond No. 5 were transferred to the same pond. Some of the stock died during the winter, so when the breeding season came on we had 589 breeders. During the winter of 1907 and 1908, plans were made to build tanks for hatching perch eggs in.

"After running the eggs one season in jars it was decided more screen area was essential and more room needed for the eggs, so two galvanized iron tanks were built. These were 4 feet 10 inches long, 1 foot 11 inches wide and 2 feet 4 inches deep at the deepest point. They are rounding on the bottom and are fed with a three-fourths inch pipe running lengthwise of the tank, this pipe being in the bottom of the tank and perforated with two rows of small holes in such a manner that when the water comes out it strikes against the rounding part of the tank and causes a motion in the water something like the waves would create when receding after coming in contact with the shore of a lake. These tanks were fitted with screens, one at the end near the overflow, and one covering the whole bottom just above the feed pipe and another eight inches above the first or bottom screen. On these two large screens the eggs or ribbons from the perch were placed. These tanks worked splendidly and will handle about 1,000,000 eggs each. The fish when hatched are raised to the surface and carried to the overflow by the current of the tanks. Owing to the large number of eggs which we tried to handle in these tanks, many of them smothered, and we only succeeded in shipping 2,760,000 fry. We had something like 6,000,000 eggs in these tanks at one time and as soon as we discovered they were going to the bad we thinned them down to about 3,000,000, and finally decided that the hatching capacity for each tank was about 1,000,000. This number can be handled with little loss and very little trouble. Owing to the limited amount of pond room available for rearing purposes, only 1,100 fingerling perch were distributed this season."

DISTRIBUTING CAR.

In one respect our distributing car "Fontinalis" seems to have the proverbial cat beaten, because the cat had only nine lives; or, to put it another way, its history suggests the story of the old woman who made one pair

of stockings last twenty-five years by alternately knitting on a new pair of legs and then a new pair of feet.

Built over twenty years ago at a cost of only \$3,500.00, it was essentially light and weak as compared with the weight and strength and solidity of up-to-date rolling stock. Many years ago the body was practically rebuilt at an outlay of nearly one-half the original cost of the car. Soon afterwards it was derailed and rolled down an embankment near Traverse City. A wrecking train pulled the trucks out of the roof of the car body and conveyed the wrenched and battered remains to the shops where the damaged parts were reassembled and repaired or renewed. Putty, paint and varnish concealed the scars and bruises.

Since then it has been pounded and strained and damaged in several minor accidents, and has had a strenuous time generally. It has been in the shops scores of times and so patched and rebuilt that probably not a vestige of the original car remains. Even its name has been changed.

Although hauled in passenger trains, our car receives more hard knocks than the average baggage car or passenger coach. The reason is that when side-tracked at a junction point where the trackage is limited it is treated as a freight car and is switched and bumped and buffeted about in the making up of freight trains. In this way the couplers and platforms have been damaged or crippled many times.

Two years ago I reported the "Fontinalis" as "all in," and apparently it was. Its sills and floors were rotted and the body was so weak and loose that when rounding some curves the doors would not stay closed, while on others they could not be opened. However, it was sent to the shops in the fall of 1907 and completely stripped. New sills were put in and all decayed parts replaced, the repair bill being \$582.00. This gave it a new lease of life, three or four years perhaps, by sending it to the shops once or twice a year or as often as required.

FISHWAYS.

It seems to be taken for granted that all dams or barriers across a river or water course should be provided with an easy and attractive stairway for the accommodation of migratory fishes that are inclined or impelled to go upstream or down. The idea is that fish must necessarily have free range of practically the entire waterway they visit or inhabit, if maximum production and reproduction is to be realized. This is undoubtedly true with respect to salmon, shad, and all species that grow in salt water and spawn in fresh. Inevitably they would soon become extinct if impassable barriers were raised between the sea and the rivers which they ascend—sometimes hundreds of miles—before spawning.

A very different problem, however, is presented in the case of strictly fresh water fishes or those that spawn and live wholly above tidewater. Here we find that reproduction occurs under a variety of conditions, according to the species. For example, brook trout in the main migrate considerable distances from their feeding range, seeking spring runs and stony or gravelly riffles; other species, like the small-mouth bass and pickerel will spawn either in still water or a current; and still others, like the large-mouth bass, though having a preference, will spawn on most any kind of a bottom. Many species inhabiting our inland waters, but not including brook trout, appear to be local in their nature; that is, they do not need to go outside of their own water for any purpose, nor do they necessarily require any considerable area or range in which to reproduce and grow to full maturity.

Within reason, no pond or lake or river, or combination of pond or lake and river, can be so fenced off one from another, as not to afford a congenial environment and all the essentials for a permanent home for several kinds of good food fish.

No one will question the value of effective fishways in small dams in brook trout streams—dams that do not develop sufficient pond exposure to materially increase the temperature and change the general character of the waterway. But a series of high dams converting a river into a chain of artificial lakes is quite a different proposition. Already a number of such dams have been built in this State, and many more will follow. In waterways thus utilized there is no need of fish ladders so far as brook trout are concerned, for they will be driven out except in the upper waters and perhaps the first power pond of a series. Other kinds will take their place, and the aggregate production of food fish will be greatly increased under the new conditions whether fish ladders are installed or not.

Taking into consideration the kinds of fish adapted to the new situation, there is much room for doubt as to whether any advantage is to be gained by providing a passageway from one pond of a series to another. The power ponds that have been built in the Muskegon River and that are being planned for the Au Sable, Manistee and other rivers, have a head of 25 to 50 feet. Lakes of no small proportions are thus created, each having a section of the river at its head for the accommodation of fish that prefer to spawn or stay in a current.

It remains to be seen whether power ponds will invade and despoil brook trout territory to any extent. Fancy or prohibitive prices for flowage rights may check for a time and in spots what many anglers will regard as an unholy invasion, but the trend of events in this intensely practical age seems to point with certainty towards the ultimate utilization of all water energies that have any considerable commercial value. Industrial development will not be denied. Nor will industrial evolution be influenced by sentimental considerations, even though many favorite haunts of one of the gamiest and most toothsome fishes in existence—"the living arrow of the white water whose dainty meat is the glancing butterfly"—be transformed into cosy homes for the plebeian rock bass and lowly bullhead. Casting sentiment aside, however, we may view the situation with complacency. With waste and sewage from factories taken care of, the creation of large reservoirs in rivers must add materially to their fishery resources, when stocked and occasionally replenished with suitable food fishes.

The whole fishway problem should be thoroughly investigated, first with reference to the necessity or advantage of fishways for certain migratory species, and second, to determine by actual trial the most efficient and economical kind or type of fish ladder for different kinds of fish and for dams of varying height.

POLLUTION OF WATERS.

For several years past unusual or epidemic losses of fish in streams that receive the sewage from beet sugar factories have been reported from time to time, in the press and by complaints addressed to the Board of Fish Commissioners. While in Lenawee county last fall my attention was called to an epidemic of this nature that occurred in the Raisin River during the past summer. Such wholesale destruction of fish was claimed by persons of undoubted veracity that a more thorough investigation was decided upon. Not finding time to personally go into this matter in detail, I later

placed the investigation in the hands of Asst. Superintendent Lydell; and also secured several affidavits by mail. From Mr. Lydell's report and these affidavits it will be seen that many miles of river were poisoned and plague-swept. Animals as tenacious of life as turtles were overcome and laid low. This fact alone leaves no room for doubt that practically all animal life from the lowest forms up, all fish as well as their food, perished under the same death-dealing influences. The evidence is equally as convincing and conclusive that the devastation was caused by poisonous refuse discharged into the river from the plant of a beet sugar factory at or near Blissfield.

While it appears that this refuse was turned loose in unusual volume at the time of the wholesale destruction, being the accumulation of more than one season, yet the evidence shows that the mortality continued to some extent for many weeks, and increased somewhat when the factory started up in the fall.

It may be taken for granted that there is no disposition to impose any unnecessary hardships or handicaps on important industrial enterprises, but it is time to sit up and take notice and to act promptly and vigorously when such enterprises become a constant menace to public health by polluting and poisoning our water courses. It is pertinent to inquire whether it is not entirely practicable to destroy or dispose of the refuse from such plants without in any way impairing their efficiency and without converting our streams into poisoned sewers. So far at least as beet sugar factories are concerned, it is said by those who claim to know that in Germany ample provision for the destruction of refuse and sewage is made in connection with the installation of every plant, and that this indispensable feature is merely a question of dollars and cents. If so, the question of cost should have no consideration whatever when weighed against the far-reaching consequences of stream pollution. It is not so much a question of the food value of the fish destroyed, which in some instances may be relatively unimportant, but the preservation for all time of some degree of purity in our streams and sources of water supply is a matter of vital public concern.

Below is a copy of my letter of instructions to Mr. Lydell and his report, also a copy of the affidavit secured by correspondence. Six of the latter were received. Mr. Lydell also picked up four photographs showing various phases of the epidemic. One of these shows a scow loaded with two tons of dead fish.

D. Lydell, Assistant Superintendent,
Comstock Park, Mich.:

Dear Sir—At your earliest convenience you are to visit Deerfield, and such other points in that locality as you may find necessary for the purpose of carefully investigating the cause and extent of an epidemic loss of fish that occurred in the Raisin River last summer, and report on same at an early date. Ascertain whether previous epidemics have occurred in recent years, also whether fish are dying to any extent at the present time or have died within the past month or two. It has been reported that the odor of decaying fish became so offensive that it was necessary to hire men to bury them, and that several tons were taken from the river near Deerfield. You will notice by the enclosed clipping that substantially the same conditions prevailed at Petersburg, in Summerfield township, down the river from Deerfield. Losses are also reported at Dundee, some four or five miles below Petersburg. It is also alleged that the fish died freely above Deerfield, as far up as Blissfield, but not at all above the latter point. If this is true

there is strong presumptive evidence that there is some relation between the epidemic and the location of a beet sugar factory on or near the banks of the river, at Blissfield. Gather all the essential facts you can that have any bearing on the situation, by personal interview with eye-witnesses and those who actually collected and buried the fish. Take signed statements or affidavits whenever deemed advisable.

Enclosed find letters of introduction to those who have taken a good deal of interest in this matter and who will assist you in collecting evidence.

I judge that it will be necessary to visit all of the villages herein mentioned and possibly points above and below. Use your own judgment as to that, also as to the other points involved.

Mr. Seymour Bower, Superintendent Michigan Fish Commission,
Detroit, Michigan:

Dear Sir—I beg leave to report as below, as per instructions in your letter, in regard to loss and burial of dead fish along the River Raisin in Lenawee county, Michigan.

It seems to be the general opinion of residents along said river and villages adjacent thereto that it was the refuse from the beet sugar factory at Blissfield that caused the enormous loss of fish, for the reason that no losses occurred above the said beet sugar factory.

The first place I visited was the village of Deerfield, in Deerfield township. Mr. Wm. Rusling, of this village, said in the presence of Mr. Burton that he thinks twelve or fourteen tons of fish were buried within three or four miles of this village. They were black bass, suckers, grass pike, carp, redhorse, bullheads and minnows of all descriptions. The first noticed were the fish suffering by coming to the surface and sticking out their noses, apparently seeking air. The fish when collected in some instances were loaded on to large scows, 9 feet wide and 16 feet long. They were then floated to a point where large pits had been excavated, and were there covered with lime and buried.

This point is about twenty miles by river from the sugar factory. The water in the stream was so polluted that it could not be used for any purpose, the farmers not even allowing their stock to get to the stream.

Mr. Burton has confirmed all that is said by Mr. Rusling.

Mr. E. E. Burnam, who has lived in this vicinity sixty-six years, says he never experienced anything that equalled the odor that came from these dead fish. Even the trains when passing through the village closed all the car windows.

Mr. L. A. Roberts says that there were between fifteen and twenty tons of these fish that he personally helped to bury, from only about one mile of the stream.

There were several other crews of men collecting and burying fish at this time, some of them working with dip nets that would hold upwards of twenty-five pounds of fish. These when filled would be taken ashore and immediately buried. They would average about thirty trips per day ashore.

Some few fish died in 1906, but nothing as compared with this season. This is the fourth season that the beet sugar factory has been in operation,

and no dead fish were discovered previous to the establishing of this factory, but it seems that no refuse was allowed to enter the river the first two seasons the factory was in operation.

The water in the river at the present time seems quite clear, and no dead fish are to be seen, neither are there any live ones. The bottom of the river seems to be carpeted with this refuse. It even clings to the twigs, logs and to bottom of boats, and everything that is in the water is covered with this refuse.

The most of the work of burying the dead fish was done July 29th and 30th, but dead fish were seen coming down the river until in October.

The following named persons were employed by the Township Board collecting and burying these fish. They were paid five dollars per day, and the figures were taken from the records of the Township Clerk. (Twenty-seven names are given.)

Mr. T. W. Atkins, Supervisor of Deerfield township, says, "I was personally present and worked with the above named persons while this work was going on."

Dr. Webster Bliss, Health Officer, Deerfield Township, says in part: "It was something awful; the odor was so great that you could hardly stand it to go within twenty rods of the river; that it is undoubtedly the refuse of the sugar factory at Blissfield that caused the loss of fish at this point. The first and big killing came when the company were cleaning out their vats in the latter part of July. Again the fish commenced dying when they started up their factory in the fall. When the fish first commenced dying the water was of a greenish color, but when the factory started the water was of a yellowish color."

The next point visited was Petersburg, about fifteen miles by river below Deerfield. Mr. W. Bacon says the dead fish were not as numerous at this point as at Deerfield. He secured some views of the dead fish along the river bank on July 29th, which accompany this report. He thinks there is only one cause for the fish dying, the refuse from the beet sugar factory at Blissfield. By river from here it is about thirty-five miles to the beet sugar factory.

The certificates of Chauncey Bacon, Ames Cake and Claud McCarty, of Petersburg, are attached to this report.

The following named persons worked at gathering and burying dead fish at Petersburg and vicinity along the River Raisin. (Thirteen names are given.)

Mr. Claud McCarty says no fish of any consequence died below Petersburg. Some dead fish were found below this point, but undoubtedly drifted down from the upper waters.

J. F. Stewart, a farmer at Petersburg, says the conditions were something awful; did not dare to even let his stock go to the river. Refuse even clings to ice along the river, and we do not know what we are going to do for ice the coming summer.

Mr. Charles Ulmer, Marshal at Petersburg, thinks everything in the way of fish life is gone in the Raisin River at this point. Tons of these fish were taken out and buried, both by the township and village authorities. Seven whole wagon loads were taken out of one raceway; about one ton per load. This is nothing compared to the conditions elsewhere farther up the river.

Mr. Rose, President of the Village of Petersburg, says: "Oh, the condition was something awful. It came on so quickly there was no time to do anything except to bury the fish and prevent the spreading of disease."

"When this refuse, or whatever it was, came rolling down the river like a tidal wave, apparently killing all fish life, and even the turtles, as it rolled along, I at once phoned all the residents along the stream that could be reached, and asked them to notify others not to let their stock get to the stream, for fear it would make them sick and kill them. The fish when fleeing before this poisonous mass appeared in great distress, as though seeking oxygen, coming to the surface continually, sticking their noses out, then rushing hither and thither, crowding up small streams in great numbers until they were jammed in and smothered."

Dr. W. A. Smith, of Petersburg, Health Officer, says: "There is no doubt in my mind but what the refuse from the sugar factory at Blissfield was the cause of the fish dying in the River Raisin at this point. Tons of fish were taken out and buried."

The next point visited was Blissfield. Mr. James Wilkinson, who lives across the street from the sugar factory, says there is at present a liquified mass running into the stream that would at least fill a four-inch tile. This is apparently the seepage from their silo and "stinks like the devil." There were plenty of fish that died below this point but none were buried here that he knows of. They were allowed to drift down stream.

Mr. A. G. Smead, farmer and acreage writer for the sugar company, said, in the presence of Messrs. Wilkinson and Staddleman, that "the sugar factory had been in operation four seasons. The first season the refuse was run into a large silo, made of planks and covering three or four acres. After the sugar factory had closed down this refuse was cleaned out and carted away. The second season the refuse was run into this silo but not cleaned out."

Instead they put in lime, intending to eat up or destroy this refuse. Apparently all it did was to liquify the whole mass. The third season the refuse was more than the silo would hold. It ran over into open ditches into the river, but not to any great extent; still some fish died this third season, or in 1907. This last summer it seems the silo had not been cleaned, but instead they tried to put more refuse in there, with the result that the whole thing broke away into the open ditches and sewers and thence into the river. This was the accumulation of two years of rotted beet pulp and lime, and the stench was something fearful. No dead fish were seen in the stream above the beet sugar factory at any time of the year.

Some legal action has been taken, I understand, by parties at Monroe and Petersburg, but not being able to ascertain exactly how far this has gone I went to the President of the Village of Petersburg. He said he would find out exactly what had been done in this direction and forward same to your office.

COPY OF AFFIDAVIT.

"That between July 29th and August 3rd, 1908, large numbers of dead fish, consisting of carp, black bass, suckers, grass pike, or pickerel, and other kinds of fish, of various sizes and ages, were removed from the Raisin River and along its banks near the Village of Deerfield; that a part of the dead fish in question were floating, part were on or near the bottom, and many others were strewn along its banks; that many of the said fish were in an advanced stage of decomposition, creating an almost unbearable

stench for a considerable distance from the river, and that the said fish were collected and buried by the ton, it being the opinion of deponent that upwards of fifteen (15) tons of dead fish were taken from said river between a point one mile above and two miles below Deerfield."

THE SHEEP AND THE GOATS.

Too little attention seems to have been given to the importance and potential value of fish protection by discrimination. Bounties are paid for killing the outcasts and outlawed among animals of the forest; and the thrifty husbandman must wage war against the weeds and thistles that would choke or destroy his crops. This principle of discriminating against that which is noxious or destructive should be taken advantage of in water life whenever and wherever practicable.

Fish that rank high as food or game are persistently pursued, and often in violation of economic as well as statutory law; but dogfish and garpike and their ilk, owing to their lack of food value, enjoy an immunity that gives them an undue advantage. As the natural enemies of high grade fish they and their kind should be attacked and destroyed in every feasible way. The taking, catching or killing of coarse or objectionable or undesirable fish that prey on the spawn or young or food of fish of high rank, should therefore be authorized and encouraged under regulations that will guard against abuses.

REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS.

The following repairs and improvements were made at the Paris hatchery in 1907 and 1908, as reported by the overseer, Mr. J. P. Marks:

1907.

Repairs to residence on Little Buckhorn Creek, west of highway.—Removed old and put new foundation under kitchen; enlarged cellar from 10 x 10 to 12 x 16 feet; painted and papered bed and living rooms, also kitchen; laid new floors in same; put new window in west side of wing; shingled roof on east side of upright and painted same.

Residence on Little Buckhorn Creek east of road.—Raised east wing and repaired foundation; laid new floors in dining room, kitchen and wood shed; built steps in front of upright, also steps and platform on east end of wing; repaired south porch and laid new floor; reshingled and painted roof of upright.

Overseer's residence.—Reshingled and painted roofs of upright, also of the north and west porches; put new swing door in place of sliding door at east end of wing; repaired window frames on south and west side of upright.

Old hatchery.—Took up old floor and raised building eight inches; put in new concrete foundation eight inches thick and from three to four inches high; laid new wood floor; put new door frame in west end, also large double doors and frame in east end; made concrete steps to front doors also 10 feet of walk 5 feet wide and 4 inches thick between old hatchery and food house.

Ice house located opposite car house.—This building was moved and rebuilt on a cement foundation south of the new hatchery, and enlarged from 8 x 10 feet to 10½ x 12½ feet, also painted one coat.

Repairs to out houses and new vaults.—Built concrete vault 6 x 10 feet 5 feet deep, with side walls 6 inches thick; put new sills, joists and floors in the out houses, also repaired the roofs; moved and set same over vaults.

Miscellaneous.—Fitted, painted and placed new storm windows on new hatchery. Repaired platforms and doors to car house. Made new feed tank 20 feet long and 14 inches deep, 8 inches wide, for old hatchery, and connected same with supply pipe.

Improvements to ponds and races.—Built and painted 26 pond shades 6 feet wide and 14 feet long.

Underbrushed and stumped land for concrete fingerling race and ditch for connecting Little Buckhorn Creek with ponds and hatchery.

Excavated for fingerling race 356 feet by 7 feet wide west of ponds, and ditch 1,010 feet long, 3 feet wide, from head of race to ditch leading from Little Buckhorn Creek to Cheney Creek so as to bring Little Buckhorn Creek water to race and present ponds.

Built one-half of proposed fingerling race or 187 feet with concrete side walls 6 inches thick and from 2 to 3 feet deep.

Connected new fingerling race with feed pipe to hatchery in order to use the Little Buckhorn water for hatching purposes, and laid 100 feet of 14 inch pump log to complete the connection.

Built concrete feed race 16 feet long, 3 feet wide, with 8 inch side walls, from creek to pond No. 1, and feed connections between ponds one and two, 10 feet long, with side walls 8 inches thick, 3 feet deep, with top and bottom 5 inches thick.

Improvements to grounds.—Set out 1,000 white pine, 500 spruce, 100 elm, 50 Norway pine and 50 white ash trees; graveled driveway from road to car house.

Other general repairs.—Repaired break in pipe used for lawn sprinkling which has burst from being frozen during winter; built two 3 x 8 iron screens for the lower wild ponds; repaired walls of feed race below railroad; repaired dam at foot of ice pond on Buckhorn Creek; repaired feed and hatching tanks in new hatchery; cleaned, stenciled and labeled all cans, also painted the inside of all rusty ones; repaired and painted hatchery floor.

1908.

Repairs and improvements to buildings.—Removed old paint from outside of new hatchery; sandpapered, puttied and painted same two coats. Sandpapered, puttied and painted overseer's residence, food and large ice house, old hatchery, tool house, small ice house and two out houses, all one coat, and steps over railroad two coats.

Shingled and painted roof of upright of barn; made store room for lumber, etc., of shed formerly used for a cow barn.

Painted office three coats and varnished office furniture.

Repairs and improvements to ponds and raceways.—Built new top on dam at foot of wild pond north of hatchery.

Removed old wooden spawning races at head of ponds Nos. 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7 and 9, and replaced them with concrete, making the walls 8 inches thick and from 3 to 4 feet deep.

Pointed walls of ponds Nos. 1 to 10 with cement; lengthened pond No. 8 ten feet, using cobble stone laid in cement for walls.

Removed all surplus sand from ponds Nos. 1 to 12 and regraveled same.

Made 14 concrete shelves at edge of ponds for garbage boxes; took up old pump log or feed pipe to pond 2 and used same to carry surplus water from new fingerling race; made concrete box screen and slash boards at head of intake to hatchery.

Built concrete pocket at head of new concrete fingerling race 12 x 12 feet with 3 foot side walls for screens and slash boards; rebuilt old and made new covers for spawning races at head of ponds Nos. 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7 and 9.

Made new slash board for all new spawning and feed races also iron screens; painted all spawning race covers and running boards two coats.

Improvements to grounds.—With the surplus sand taken from ponds, graded between driveway and fence in upper grove.

Raised ground around ponds Nos. 1 to 10 and resodded same.

Repaired and rebuilt 40 feet of cement walk 5 feet wide and 4 inches thick between old hatchery and food house.

Set out 50 ornamental shrubs around grounds, and hedge from overseer's residence to highway.

Other general repairs.—Painted democrat wagon; repaired and painted all ladders and put in new rungs; repaired pond shades; put new floor in horse stable.

Painted and varnished kitchen, dining room and parlor floors in overseer's residence.

Removed and replaced broken window lights in old and new hatcheries.

Made screen and slash boards for intake to hatchery; painted storm windows to hatchery and overseer's residence.

Painted two lumber wagons, one pair of sleighs and pung, also varnished buggy and democrat wagon.

Repaired and painted all spawning racks for ponds; repaired and rewired 250 fish trays.

Number and size of buildings and what they are used for.

1 Hatchery known as new hatchery, 40 x 82 feet.

1 Hatchery known as old hatchery, 20 x 60 feet.

1 Ice house, 18 x 18 feet.

1 Ice house, 10½ x 12½ feet.

1 Food house, also used for paint shop, 18 x 24 feet.

1 Tool house, 10½ x 12½ feet.

1 Storage shed, 14 x 20 feet.

1 Barn, 24½ x 30 feet, with shed 14 x 24½ feet.

1 Overseer's residence, upright 28 x 30 feet, wing 20 x 30 feet.

1 Corn crib, 6½ x 16½ feet.

1 Employees' residence on Little Buckhorn Creek, 20 x 26½ feet.

1 Employees' residence on Little Buckhorn Creek, Upright 16 x 24 feet, wing, 20½ feet.

1 Barn, 20 x 38 feet.

1 Car house, 20 x 80 feet.

6 Outhouses, 4 x 6 feet each.

1 14-ft. windmill, 40 feet high from ground to pump water for tank.

1 Water tank, base 16 feet from ground, 12 feet deep and 16 feet in diameter.

MILL CREEK.

The following repairs and improvements were made at Mill Creek station during the years 1907 and 1908, as reported by Mr. Lydell:

The permanent improvements at this station have not been very many on account of the small amount of moneys available, although some new work has been done. One new building has been erected for a wagon shed

and storage room, which is 32 feet long by 18 feet wide, and is 13 feet 6 inches high, with a good cement foundation. The upper part of this building is used for storing purposes and the lower part is open on one side and is used for wagons, boats, etc. It has been given one coat of paint and the roof was treated to one coat of shingle stain.

The barn at this station when built was to be used for mainly storage. It was only one story high. The roof of this building has been raised four and one-half feet, making a loft for hay, grain, etc.

Two new boats have been built 14 feet long and 3 feet wide. These boats are used for collecting fry from outside waters. Six of these boats are now in use at this station during the collecting season.

Three retaining screens for use while collecting fry from outside waters were built in 1907. These screens are 6 feet long, 2 feet wide and 2 feet deep, and are covered with galvanized wire of about one-eighth inch mesh.

Four new collecting cans have also been bought. These cans are larger than the common can used for shipping, and are made with a double cover, the outer one being about 6 inches deep. While shipping fish these covers are filled with ice.

Two new galvanized tanks to be used in boats when taking fry from lake or pond have been purchased.

An extension to the chimney at the dwelling has been put up.

A small shanty or camp has been erected at Duck Lake collecting station. This is 12 x 20 feet, is one story high and built of rough lumber, and the roof covered with "Rubberoid" roofing. It is only used about four weeks each season, taking the place of tents that were used prior to the erection of this camp.

One coal stove was purchased for the office.

Two acres of land were purchased from the H. D. Plumb Estate adjoining the present property owned by the Commission. In the winter of 1907 the brush, etc., was cleared from this property, but as no more funds were available, nothing further was done.

Thirty grape vines were purchased and set at intervals along the Page wire fence on the west side of the grounds. Some other shrubbery, such as spirea and hardy hydrangeas have been set out.

One fry tank 12 feet long, 3 feet wide and 2 feet deep was built for perch, and two tanks for hatching perch eggs in were made of galvanized iron. These galvanized tanks are 4 feet 10 inches long, 1 foot 11 inches wide and 2 feet 4 inches deep. Owing to the lack of room in the present hatchery, a platform was constructed on the lawn in front of the building on which this tank and hatching apparatus was placed.

A connecting pipe has been put in from pond No. 1 to pond No. 3. This is a 5-inch iron pipe, and was put in to furnish water to ponds Nos. 3 and 5, while pond No. 4, from which they formerly derived their water supply, was being cleaned. Ponds No. 2 and No. 4 were formerly connected by a narrow neck of water. This neck has been filled in, two separate ponds resulting therefrom, making a wintering or retaining pond of No. 2. A 6-inch iron pipe connecting ponds No. 2 and No. 4 was also put in, with a raceway in pond No. 2. The raceway in pond "D" has been replaced with a new one. The old one was about rotted away.

The main dam at this station has been repaired several times in the last two years, but only temporarily. The east side was replaced with concrete in the latter part of 1907. It is in very poor condition and in immediate need of further repairs.

The springs from which we derive our spring water supply have to be cleaned several times each season. These should be walled up and a concrete bottom put in. The boiler and pump at this station is repaired and inspected once each season.

The screens at the dwelling have been repaired, new wire furnished where needed, and all have been painted.

The roof of the hatchery and ice house have been given two coats of good roof paint.

The wall on the north side of the creek where injured by flood has been repaired and put in good condition. The creek below the present dam became clogged with flood-wood, etc. This has all been cleaned out, the brush cut away and a good wide opening made to allow the water to get away quickly.

The bottom of the old fry tanks in the hatchery rotted away, and have been replaced with cement.

The banks of pond No. 7 have been riprapped with stone to prevent washing away by the waves.

A new base has been put in for the flag pole and the pole painted.

New truss rods have been put on the foot bridge.

All screens for tanks, ponds, etc., have been repaired and painted and put in good condition.

The main pump log that furnishes water to the ponds has been repaired several times in the last two seasons, but is in a dangerous condition and should be replaced.

All cans have been painted inside and the numbers renewed, about six hundred in number.

DRAYTON PLAINS.

The following repairs and improvements were made at the Drayton Plains Station during the biennial period ending December 31, 1908, as reported by the overseer, Mr. J. L. Brass.

1907.

Fencing.—About 240 rods of wire fence were built, with gates where necessary. This practically completes the boundary lines of the property and includes the enclosure of about four acres of high land now devoted to orchard, hay-field and pasture for horse after the hay crop is harvested.

Tree planting.—In early spring of this year trees were set out for shade and improvement. A list of the number and kind is as follows: Oak, quite large, 2; silver leaf maple, eight year old stock, 36; American elm, two year old stock, 100; catalpa, two year old stock, 50; spruce, seedlings, 100; pine, seedlings, 500; Norway pine, two year old stock, 50.

Great care was exercised in setting out these trees to insure their successful and rapid growth.

New Barn.—A new horse barn was also built this year. This was built of cement blocks made on the grounds in a mould purchased for the purpose. An excellent grade of gravel for this work was found when excavating for the barn foundations.

1908.

Ponds.—Two new ponds were added to the number this year, making a total of nine. They range in size from 20 x 75 ft., to 225 x 550 ft. The

waters in them vary in depth from 1 ft. to 11 ft. Their total area equals 5.15 acres.

Miscellaneous Improvements.—Gravel driveways have been built through the grounds wherever continued driving and trucking have made them necessary.

One thousand feet of public highway that crosses the grounds is kept free from weeds and grass and kept in repair by this station.

The grounds about the buildings have now been graded uniformly and grass is nicely growing on most of it. The poorest portions of the lawn are annually fertilized with rich black muck and other fertilizers.

The banks of the ponds have been repaired as needed and paved with stone below the water line as time permitted.

Extension screens have been provided for all inlets and outlets to ponds. The equipment was painted and repaired when necessary.

Number and size of Buildings.

Overseer's Dwelling.—Brick and wood; brick part low two-story, 20 x 30 ft.; wood part upright, low two-story, 16 x 20 ft., on north end of brick part; a kitchen built on east side of wood part, 12 x 14 ft.; a wood shed east of kitchen 14 x 14 feet.

Hatchery Building.—Large square-timber frame two-story 28 x 48 ft.; on ground floor a room 10 x 16 feet is partitioned off for office; another room 12 x 20 feet is used for ice house; balance of this floor is used for storage of wagons, cans and small tools. Second floor has Commissioners' room, 12 x 18 feet; workshop 14 x 36 feet; balance a general store room fitted with net and clothes lockers. Large attic used for storage of light equipment.

Horse Barn.—Built of cement blocks, two-story, 18 x 32 feet, with basement under all. Basement used for storage of light tools, fuel, etc. Ground floor is fitted with enclosed box stall for horse, 9 ft. x 12 ft. Harness and robe room underneath stairway. Balance of floor used for carriage room. A good well of water on this floor. Upper story used for hay, straw and grain bin.

Boat House.—One-story frame 16 x 24 feet, containing five boats, one steel row boat and four small flat-bottomed boats built of wood and used for pond and field work.

SAULT STE. MARIE.

The following repairs and changes were made during the biennial period, as reported by Mr. H. H. Marks, overseer.

Changes in Water Supply and Waste.—In September, 1907, the forebay of the old Edison Power Plant was abandoned and the water cut off at the railroad trestle above, making it necessary to change the connection of our twenty-inch main from the old to the new forebay. In anticipation of this change a section of the water main was laid the year previous, before the embankment was made.

In April, 1908, Mr. L. C. Sabin, General Superintendent of St. Mary's Falls Canal, notified me that the Government would shortly commence to build a cofferdam, which would shut off our water supply. By June first the water supply from our twenty-inch main was cut off by the construction of a clay dam near our intake. In anticipation of the water supply being cut off, the pond fish had previously been transferred and the ponds

abandoned, and we were forced to plan for a new supply and waste for the hatchery proper. These changes had to be made, as the clay dam entirely surrounded the hatchery and grounds. The ponds could not be used, nor could any water be discharged into the enclosure, as it would leak into the lockpit and have to be pumped out. It was therefore decided to lay a five-inch feed pipe from the south penstock of the new Edison plant to the hatchery, also a six-inch tile sewer from the hatchery to the tailrace. Both the feed and sewer pipes were necessarily carried over the top of the clay dam.

Roofing and Other Repairs.—In September, 1907, a contract was let for roofing the hatchery with Paroid paper roofing, and this work was completed about the middle of October. Three of the living rooms were papered and a hardwood floor was laid in the sitting room.

Transfer of Pond Stock.—The fingerling and yearling brook trout were transferred to Paris in October, 1907, and the adult brook and rainbow trout to the Government Park ponds.

Number and size of Buildings.

Main Hatchery.—Building 40 x 80 feet and two stories high. The ground floor is divided into two hatching rooms, an office and hallway. One hatching room is equipped for hatching whitefish and lake trout. The battery and tanks for whitefish have a capacity of 40,000,000. This room also contains six Clark hatching troughs for lake trout, having a capacity of 4,000,000. The other hatching room is used for trout exclusively, and has a capacity of 5,000,000. The east half of the second story contains six living rooms, occupied by the overseer; the west part of this story is used as a storeroom and carpenter shop. On the east end of the hatchery there is a wing 24 x 30 feet, used for the heating plant, coal bin, ice house, refrigerator, and apparatus for cutting fish food.

Recommendations.—On account of negotiations by the Government, which may sooner or later result in permanently cutting off our water supply, I recommend that no improvements or repairs be made for the present.

HARRIETTA.

The following repairs and improvements were made at Harrietta, as reported by the overseer, G. C. Dickerson.

1907.

Improvements to Supply Canal from Slagle Creek to Ponds.—This canal is 580 feet long. During the summer the sides of the canal were sloped and the top of the banks graded. A concrete bulkhead was built at the head of the canal, also a concrete dam near the foot, to raise the level above the intakes to fry races.

New Feeding Races for Fry.—Four new fry races, each 150 feet long and 3½ feet wide, were built of concrete, with a three-foot concrete walk between each race. A 10 x 18 ft. concrete apron was built at the outlet, and a concrete wall on both sides of the feed canal at the head, each 30 feet long. On account of the lay of the ground and of its being mucky and springy, an unusual amount of excavation was necessary; also refilling with sand to make a suitable foundation.

Miscellaneous.—Made pond shades and 23 covers for fry races and 10 for spawning races, all painted two coats.

1908.

New Ponds.—Built six concrete ponds, each 5 feet wide, 3 feet deep and 82 feet long, with concrete bulkheads at foot connecting with a series of ponds below on a lower level. A concrete walk 5 feet wide is laid across the head of the lower ponds, with steps leading to the highway. The walls of the ponds on the lower level have only been commenced, but the foundations are laid throughout. A large amount of excavating and refilling was required. To strengthen the foundation and bridge quicksand pockets a row of cedar piles was driven on the line of every wall.

Miscellaneous Repairs and Improvements.—The ground around the fry races built last fall was graded and sodded, and the cover frames were tarred two coats.

The banks of the pond west of the hatchery were sloped and sodded. A concrete raceway, 4 feet wide and 23 feet long, was built at the head of this pond, also a concrete waste box and flume at the outlet.

A concrete foundation wall was built under the hatchery, and the ground floor room was ceiled overhead. An office was partitioned off in the second story and painted two coats. The hatchery was painted two coats inside and three coats outside. Four new fry troughs were made.

A number of new pond shades were made for ponds north of the highway, also two bulkheads to inlets, with screens for same.

Two carloads of cobblestone have been delivered and placed along the banks of the canal connecting Slagle Creek with the ponds. These are to be used to pave the bottom of the canal to prevent washing. The bottom is of muck or quicksand nearly all the way.

The unsightly sand bluff in front of the residence has been graded down and sodded, and a stone gutter laid between the sodding and the highway.

There are three buildings on the premises, viz: A two-story hatchery, 26 x 38 feet; a barn 20 x 24 feet; and a cottage 28 x 40 feet with an addition 22 x 26 feet.

DETROIT.

Under the terms of our lease to the Bureau of Fisheries, all repairs and improvements at the Detroit hatchery are made at the expense of the government.

Extensive as well as expensive improvements were made during the past two years. One of the whitefish batteries, comprising one-half of the hatching facilities of the entire plant, was rebuilt complete, including foot tanks. The eight large tanks in the tank room, covering practically the entire storage capacity for fry, were likewise replaced with new tanks and connections complete.

DISTRIBUTION.

Below is a table showing the total output for the years 1907 and 1908, which is all that could reasonably be expected from our facilities in their present stage of development:

The term "fry" in the above table refers to fish that have lost the food sac, or nearly so, and are ready to swim up freely and take food. The time required to absorb this sac varies greatly, according to species and water temperatures. In the case of brook trout the sac is relatively large and disappears slowly in the cool or cold water in which the young are carried; hence they are several weeks old when shipped out as fry. The food sac of young black bass and wall-eyed pike is absorbed in a few days. White-fish, though hatched in cold water, also shad that are hatched in quite warm water, have a food sac so small that the fish swim up freely immediately after hatching.

"Advanced fry" covers the period between the absorption of the food sac or the end of the fry stage until a length of one inch is reached. This is the first feeding stage.

"Fingerlings" mean fish from one inch long to one year old; fingerlings

No. 1 are fish between one and two inches in length; fingerlings No. 2 are fish between two and three inches in length, and so on up to fish one year old.

The above standard was unanimously adopted at the annual meeting of the American Fisheries Society in 1905, on the recommendation of a Committee of which I was a member.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

I urgently advise that the general plan of expansion and advancement indicated in the opening pages of this report be carried out at the earliest possible date. There are also many hold-over repair items to be taken care of, the urgent nature of which has been explained in detail in former reports.

A number of repairs, such as a new dam and water main at the Mill Creek plant, and new roofs, floors and tanks at Paris, have reached the emergency stage. Every item in the nature of repairs and improvements and extensions included in the estimates for the ensuing biennial period should be approved and provided for. Ranking in importance are the emergency items that are indispensable to the safety and protection of our water supply, hatchery and pond equipment. Next in importance is the addition of every facility that bears directly on increased production, that the supply of young fish may be brought within hauling distance of the demand. If disallowances must be made or items carried forward, let them be such as do not immediately affect production, however desirable and necessary they may be from the standpoint of convenience or long range economies. Under present conditions it will be better by far that lawns should go unmowed and buildings unpainted than to interfere with the production of increased numbers of food and game fishes of the right kind and size.

HISTORICAL.

COMMISSIONERS.

Under the Act of 1873 George Clark, of Ecrose, George H. Jerome, of Niles, and Governor John J. Bagley, of Detroit, ex officio, constituted the first Board of Fish Commissioners. They held their first meeting May 12th, 1873. George H. Jerome resigned June 15, 1874, to become Secretary and Superintendent, and Andrew J. Kellogg, of Allegan, was appointed Commissioner to fill the vacancy. This board was done away with by the reorganization act of 1875. Under this act the Governor, on April 24th, 1875, appointed Eli R. Miller for two years, Andrew J. Kellogg for four years, and George Clark for six years.

Eli R. Miller was reappointed January 1st, 1877, and retired at the expiration of his term, January 1st, 1883, and John H. Bissell, of Detroit, was appointed to succeed him. Mr. Bissell retired at the expiration of his term, January 1st, 1889, and Hoyt Post, of Detroit, was appointed as his successor. Mr. Post retired at the expiration of his term, January 1st, 1895, and F. B. Dickerson, of Detroit, succeeded him. His first term expired January 1st, 1901, and he was reappointed for six years. He retired at the expiration of his second term, January 1st, 1907, and Mr. D. H. Power, of Suttons was appointed to succeed him. Mr. Power's term will expire January, 1913.

Andrew J. Kellogg's first term under the act of 1875 expired January 1st, 1879, and he was reappointed for six years. He resigned June 1st, 1884, to become secretary, and Herschel Whitaker was appointed to fill the vacancy. In 1885 Mr. Whitaker was reappointed for six years, his second term expiring January 1st, 1901. He died May 5th, 1900, and Mr. Walter Schweikert, of Detroit, was appointed to fill the vacancy until the next session of the legislature, when George M. Brown, of Saginaw, was appointed to fill the remainder of Mr. Whitaker's term to January 1st, 1903. In 1903 he was reappointed for six years, his present term expiring January 1st, 1909.

George Clark died October 14, 1877, and Dr. Joel C. Parker, of Grand Rapids, was appointed to fill the vacancy. His term expired January 1st, 1881, and he was reappointed for six years, and at the expiration of that term, in January, 1887, he was again reappointed for six years, the term expiring January 1st, 1893, when he retired. Horace W. Davis, of Grand Rapids, was appointed to succeed him, his first term expiring January 1st, 1899, and he was reappointed for six years, the term expiring January 1st 1905. In June, 1902, he resigned as Commissioner and was appointed Overseer of Drayton Plains station. Mr. C. D. Joslyn, of Detroit, was appointed to fill the vacancy caused by Mr. Davis's resignation, the term expiring January 1st, 1905, when he was reappointed for six years, his present term expiring January 1st, 1911.

SUPERINTENDENT.

George H. Jerome was acting superintendent from the first organization of the Commission, May 12, 1873, until June 15, 1874, when he resigned as Commissioner and was appointed superintendent, and served as such until September 15th, 1879, when his term expired and he refused a reappointment. James G. Portman, of Watervliet, was appointed superintendent September 15, 1879, to succeed Mr. Jerome, and served as such until September, 1882, when he was succeeded by Oren M. Chase. Mr. Chase served until November 11th, 1883, when he was drowned in Little Traverse Bay while in the performance of his duties. Thereupon Walter D. Marks was made acting superintendent and served in that capacity until March 26th, 1884, when he was appointed superintendent and served until June 30, 1893, when he was retired and Seymour Bower was appointed to succeed him and at this date, November 1st, 1908, is still serving in that capacity.

SECRETARY.

George H. Jerome was secretary from the first organization of the Board, May 12th, 1873, until September 15th, 1879, when he withdrew from the Commission and James G. Portman was appointed to succeed him. Mr. Portman acted as secretary until September, 1882, when he was dismissed, and on February 19th, 1883, Herschel Whitaker was appointed secretary and served until June 1st, 1884, when he resigned and Andrew J. Kellogg was appointed to succeed him. Mr. Kellogg served as secretary until March 20th, 1888, when he resigned and George D. Mussey, of Detroit, was appointed, and at this date, (November 1st, 1908) is still serving as secretary.
