SEVENTEENTH BIENNIAL REPORT OF THE MICHIGAN STATE
BOARD OF FISH COMMISSIONERS.

To His Excellency the Governor:

We herewith submit the report of the State Board of Fish Commissioners for the biennial period from July 1, 1904, to June 30, 1906, and also the report of the Superintendent.

The latter is so full and complete in detail that it leaves little to be said concerning the work of the Board, except perhaps some few general observations.

As was done in our last report, we have in this carried the tables of our distribution of fish beyond the 30th day of June, 1906, so as to include what properly belongs to the work accomplished during the season. Without this, our reports would be misleading.

This last biennial period, while it shows an improvement, is not as satisfactory as it might have been. In making the estimates for appropriations needed, it has been the practice of the Board to make them upon a strictly business basis. It has never asked for an appropriation that was not strictly necessary to produce the best and most economical results. While it is true that every Legislature has cut down the appropriations considerably below the estimates made by the Board, yet the Board has not resorted to the practice of padding its estimates to meet such action of the Legislature. The practice of making close and business-like estimates will be continued so long as the Board retains its present management.

A well digested resume of the work of the Board was made in the report for the biennial period ending June 30th, 1904, to which the Board begs leave to refer for such general information.

We believe it to be our duty to call attention to the complicated condition of our fish laws, both general and local. Without going into details, it is sufficient to say that our general laws are in a number of instances conflicting. There is a large number of laws relative to the erection of fish chutes over dams of the different rivers of the State. We believe that all of these laws should be repealed and one law operating uniformly over the State enacted. Now that so many of our streams are stocked with food fishes, the importance of compelling the construction of fish ladders or chutes if it is feasible over the various dams that are being constructed becomes of the highest importance. Large dams for power plants are now being erected in different parts of the State from twenty to thirty or more feet in height. At the foot of these dams great quantities of fish collect in their desire to get up the stream. Whether such fish ladders or chutes are feasible or not may be a serious question. We recommend that this subject be given careful attention.

With regard to the local laws, it may be said that some lakes are situated in more than one county and are subject sometimes to two or more conflicting statutes. The operation of the general laws are suspended, or partially suspended, in some localities. All sorts of local acts relating to certain inland lakes and streams have been passed, supposed to be beneficial to the locality when in fact it is not only harmful to that locality but to many others. Legislative permission is given in some instances to spear suckers and kindred fish. This is a serious mistake. Suckers are very prolific and their young and the young of similar fishes provide food for bass and other table fish, and oftentimes it will be found that, when the suckers are gone, the means of subsistence for other and better fishes has gone with them. The Board is aware of the fact that suckers are a spawn eating fish, yet the various kinds of bass defend their nests, so that the injury done by suckers is comparatively small.

We have repeatedly called attention to the condition of affairs at Sault Ste. Marie. The federal government being in control of the land, it is only a question of time when that hatchery will have to be abandoned; so far as the State is concerned, but it is an advantageous point for a federal government hatchery and the Board has made an effort to dispose of the hatchery to the government. A bill has been introduced in Congress providing an appropriation for this purpose but it has not yet become a law. The Board is expending at that hatchery just barely enough to maintain the present work there and to maintain the buildings in decent repair, but it is only a question of a very short time when a hatchery will be required elsewhere in the State, preferably somewhere in the Northern Peninsula.

In the meantime, it will be necessary to continue the work at the present hatchery. It is of course necessary so long as the hatchery is maintained to make appropriations for its maintenance.

The Board would be pleased to have a most careful scrutiny made of its work, including its expenditures, and is glad at all times to receive suggestions from any and all who are interested.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT.

State Board of Fish Commissioners, Detroit, Mich.:

Gentlemen:—I respectfully submit herewith a report of the practical operations carried on under the direction of the Board during the years 1905 and 1906, with recommendations covering such repairs, improvements and expansion of facilities as are necessary to increase the production of the better grades of fish, for which there is a constantly growing demand throughout the State.

The total output for the years 1905 and 1906 follows, the details as to points of delivery, waters stocked, etc., being given in the Distribution Tables.

PARIS STATION.

In view of the limited supply of spring water available for carrying a brood stock of brook trout, the production of eggs at this station is satisfactory; in fact, is all that can reasonably be expected from the pond area that the volume of water suitable for brook trout will support.

No epidemics nor unusual loss of fish above fingerling size have occurred in recent years. A considerable loss, however, is still sustained each spawning season, though the annual mortality as the result of stripping and handling has decreased during the past five or six years. The females are given a strong salt bath after being stripped and then set free for a few weeks in a gravel bottom section of the creek that feeds the ponds. Several seasons trial of this plan has demonstrated its effectiveness in checking excessive mortality following the spawning season. They appear to recuperate more readily in a shoal current over gravel and there is a material decrease in the loss as compared with the old plan of transferring them from spawning ponds and races direct to their regular feeding ponds.

All brook trout thirty-two months old and upwards are sorted about October first and placed in the spawning compartments. The trout twenty months old are also sorted, but only the larger females, about one-third of the stock, are reserved for stripping. Experience has shown that it is more profitable in the long run not to attempt to spawn the smaller trout of this age, the yield of eggs being too light to compensate the loss of fish by handling.

It has been the practice to continue feeding the breeders, though sparingly, while in the spawning ponds, but feeding was entirely suspended the past season. The period of fasting ranged from ten days for some fish to two months for others, according to the time of occupancy of these ponds. The loss of spawning fish was about 6 per cent less than during the preceding spawning season, but whether credit is due to the fasting must be determined more definitely by further experiments in this direction.

The station is well located with reference to the hatching and distribution of brook, rainbow and lake trout, and should remain as heretofore the main distributing center for these fish for Lower Peninsula waters. The water supply is ample for hatching purposes to the fullest capacity of both hatchery buildings, but the flow available for pond supply of the right quality and temperature for brook trout is too limited to admit of a marked increase in the number of brook trout of spawning age that may be safely carried; hence, we cannot hope to materially increase the production of brook trout eggs at this station from brood stock reared and held there for that purpose. The shortage in the egg producing as compared with the egg hatching capacity of the plant must therefore continue to be made up from other sources.

The combined flow of the three creeks comprising the water supply,

the Cheney, Big Buckhorn and Little Buckhorn, continues to diminish in dry weather and increase in times of heavy rains and melting snows, a natural result of drawing the line of cleared lands closer and closer towards the timbered property controlled by the Board. These changed and changing conditions, however, are confined almost wholly to the Cheney and Big Buckhorn. The volume of snow water now draining into these creeks at the close of winter or during a January thaw, often greatly augmented by cold rains, lowers the temperature abnormally for brook trout fry in the sac stage, checking normal development and causing some loss, if continued too long. These adverse conditions occur, too, at the height of the incubating and hatching season, when the hatchery is filled with eggs and fry in the sac stage.

The Little Buckhorn, however, continues to hold its own well, both in volume and quality, originating wholly, as it does, on State lands and being protected all along by a timber belt controlled by the Board. Unlike the Cheney and the Big Buckhorn, the Little Buckhorn is not unduly or injuriously affected by floods or surface influences. For this reason the hatchery main should be supplied exclusively from the little Buckhorn instead of tapping the stream formed by a combination of the three creeks. This will necessitate extending the twelve-inch main some 80 or 90 rods; or perhaps an open ditch will serve every purpose, its path being well protected all the way by timber and undergrowth.

But whether resulting from rains or snow, or both, or in volume that is small or rising to flood proportions, the surface drainage that must seek outlet through the ponds causes no injury or loss to the pond stock in cold weather. In warm weather, however, the surface flow from a series of heavy rains results in a noticeable increase in the loss of brook trout, more especially the fry and fingerlings. In dry summer seasons, or in times of drought, when the flow is reduced to its lowest stage but is wholly of spring origin, the brook trout in the ponds and races are nearly free from disease and the loss is small; but there is a marked increase in mortality in "wet" seasons.

The brood rainbow trout are practically immune from loss by disease. In summer or winter, regardless of whether the volume or temperature of the water supply is unduly high or abnormally low, the loss of these fish by disease is insignificant at all times, though there is naturally an increased loss during the spawning season. They are much more hardy than brook trout, much less susceptible to loss by disease under widely varying conditions in the general character of the water supply.

It is evident, therefore, that the changed conditions affecting the water supply demands such corresponding changes as are necessary to meet the present situation, that the productive capacity of the plant may be substantially increased and properly safeguarded:

First—The water supply for all eggs and fry while incubating and developing in the hatching and feeding troughs should be drawn exclusively from the Little Buckhorn, as above noted, wholly displacing the present supply, which has gradually become a menace to their safety.

Second—The present stock of brook trout should be supplanted by

rainbow trout, as speedily as the latter can be grown to take their place.

The distribution of brook trout from Paris need not be decreased on this account, in fact may and should be largely increased, but the eggs can be produced in much larger numbers and more economically at the Harrietta plant, when the latter is equipped to utilize its great reserve of spring and creek water.

On the other hand, the production of eggs at Paris may be largely increased by substituting rainbow trout for brook trout. The pond development suitable for the latter has practically reached its limit, but pond room in which rainbows may be carried with ease and safety can be increased nearly or quite three-fold. A number of races and small ponds for the younger stock should be added above the present pond limits, while below a series of larger and deeper ponds for the large fish should be carried down to the Muskegon River, thence southward and parallel with the river.

In addition, the valley and gorge of the Big Buckhorn between the highway and railroad present a favorable opportunity for the development of two or three large ponds of a depth of 8 to 12 feet, if desired, more suitable in every respect than any of our present ponds, for the largest size rainbows that can be grown.

As the water supply at Paris will carry more rainbow trout than brook trout, per unit of flow and pond room, it is not a matter of doubt that with the pond extension indicated and all pond room given up to rainbows, the stock of breeding fish at this station may be increased three-fold and carried with a smaller aggregate loss than occurs at present.

There is, moreover, urgent need of greatly increasing our output of rainbows. We do not and cannot with our present stock of rainbow breeders supply the demand for the young fish. It is true that there is strong opposition and justly so to the introduction of rainbow trout in high grade brook trout waters, but the area of rainbow waters has greatly increased and inevitably must continue to increase. Like the water supply at Paris, the character of many of our larger streams has changed through the conversion of timber areas into agricultural lands. Large streams that from sources to mouth were once well adapted to brook trout are no longer so, as a whole, the lower waters at the present time being suitable only for rainbows.

The distribution of lake trout from Paris continues to be made from eggs supplied by the Bureau of Fisheries. By actual trial we have found that better hatching results are obtained by developing the eggs in water of a lower temperature than the winter average at Paris; hence they are held at the Soo station until well advanced towards the hatching stage.

For a number of years past consignments of grayling eggs have been received at Paris from a collecting station in Montana operated by the Bureau of Fisheries. The number of eggs usually received each season has been about 100,000, and invariably they have reached Paris in excellent condition. The young fish have been placed in streams in which native grayling were formerly abundant, the larger plantings going to the headwaters of the Manistee River. During the past summer special inquiry was made as to the results of the plants in the

Manistee, but so far as could be ascertained not one of these fish has been seen or taken. The suspension of this work is therefore recommended pending further investigation as to the results of previous efforts.

Few who are not familiar with the situation realize the magnitude of the task of attempting to provide an adequate annual supply of trout and bass for the thousands of suitable waters throughout the State, and the demand for these fish has far outgrown the possibilities of production under present facilities. Every effort has therefore been made and all available current funds have been used to increase the output, resulting in cutting down the repair fund to the lowest practical limit. Necessary repairs have been passed over year after year in order that more eggs might be purchased from trout growers who are in the business of raising trout for the table. We have needed and shall continue to need all the trout eggs and more than we can afford to buy, in addition to all that we can produce under greatly enlarged facilities.

As the plant at Paris is the oldest now under control of the Board and hence is in the greatest need of repairs, naturally it has suffered more from a scant repair fund than any other station. Until quite recently patching and postponing has been the order of the day for a number of years. A long list of needed repairs and improvements had therefore accumulated at the beginning of the biennial period under consideration. During that time a fair start has been made towards catching up on the repair work, though most of the larger items are still untouched. The principal items disposed of under this head the past two seasons are as follows:

- Concrete dam at foot of seven ponds.
- Four concrete spawning races.
- Three concrete races, two for supply and one for discharge.
- One new pond 16x35 feet, concrete walls and connections, to replace the old fry races south of the old hatchery.
- Concrete sidewalk in front of old hatchery and food house.
- Concrete bridge 9x12, at the head of waste ditch.
- Concrete wall on both sides of creek at head of ponds, 75 feet long by 4 feet high.
- Rebuilt fry race from spring to head of ponds, race 400 feet long, 2 feet 8 inches wide inside and 20 inches deep.
- Rebuilt two ponds and repaired two others below railroad, including the rebuilding of two sluice-ways.
- Provided six portable pond shades, 10x12.
- Repaired and rebuilt a number of race covers and pond screens.
- Repaired and pointed up walls of eleven ponds.
- Covered roof of east wing of residence with Cary's cement roofing.
- Provided gravelled driveway from highway to fry races in upper grove.

The following repairs and improvements should be provided for in our next appropriation:

All wood flumes, dams and races that have fallen into decay and are beyond repair should be replaced with concrete, completing the repairs and improvements of this nature that were started in 1905.

A concrete floor in the main hatchery. The present floor has been patched and repatched, but the joists are decayed beyond repair, allowing the tanks and troughs to settle in places.

A concrete foundation and new wood floor in the old hatchery. The present foundation is badly decayed and the building has settled unevenly. As nearly one-half of this building is used as a work shop, a wood floor is recommended instead of concrete.

Concrete foundation and floor for storage shed.

Two coats of paint for outside of all buildings and woodwork, as well as inside of hatcheries, workshop and food house. No buildings have been painted outside for eight years.

New roof for both hatcheries, tool house, food house and upright of residence, a total of about 10,000 square feet.

Deepen and rebuild wild pond north of the hatchery. In its present condition this pond is practically of no value but can be made one of the most serviceable on the premises.

Repair and deepen ponds below hatchery. These ponds are too shoal for the most satisfactory service.

Provide independent connection between the Little Buckhorn and the hatchery, to improve the quality of the water supply for hatching purposes.

Extend races and pond development above and below present pond limits to increase facilities for growing and holding breeding fish, as heretofore explained. This involves the extension of the waste canal from its present terminus to the Muskegon River.

Two foot bridges across waste ditch west of the highway and one wagon bridge below railroad track. Concrete is recommended.

Heating plant for hatchery. A more satisfactory and economical heating service should be provided by installing a steam or hot water plant. Coal should be substituted for wood, the price of the latter having doubled in the past ten years.

Lighting plant for hatchery and residence. Oil lamps should go into the discard with wood stoves. The service is poor and expensive. Our oil bills at Paris amount to \$80 to \$100 per year. An up-to-date lighting plant will afford a much better service at half the operating expense.

Icehouse for supplying fish car. The one in use is in bad condition and is much too small for the purpose.

Gas engine and pump. A reliable power is needed to replace the windmill used for filling the storage tank, to maintain an unfailing source of supply for the lawn sprinklers and to furnish power for grinding food.

Storm windows for hatchery. Double windows will pay first cost in two or three seasons' savings in fuel bills.

Minor repairs and improvements, including gutter around hatchery, concrete vaults for outhouses, and minor repairs to buildings and hatchery equipment.

SAULT STE. MARIE STATION.

The kinds of fish distributed from this station by the State during the past two years were brook trout, rainbow trout, lake trout, wall-eyed pike and landlocked salmon. With the exception of small plantings in the St. Mary's River, the output was placed exclusively in inland lakes and streams of the Upper Peninsula.

In addition to the above, liberal numbers of whitefish and lake trout were hatched each spring by the Bureau of Fisheries and placed in upper Great Lake waters. The Soo hatchery was established and equipped for propagating commercial fish as well as brook trout, before the commercial service was turned over to the federal government, hence it is advantageous to both the State and the government to use this equipment, which would otherwise stand idle. The eggs are taken at various points by the Government Bureau and partly developed at other stations, then transferred in early spring to the Soo hatchery, where the hatching and distribution is completed in May and June.

The introduction of rainbow trout into the St. Mary's River, beginning with the season of 1898, has been a distinct success and has resulted in permanently establishing the species in those waters. The temperature and food conditions of this river appear to be most congenial for rainbows and well adapted to their rapid growth. A number of specimens of five pounds and upwards to nine pounds have been taken there during the past two or three years.

In view of the limited numbers available for planting in this river, the introduction of landlocked salmon has likewise been successful, a considerable number of two and three year old salmon having been taken during the past two seasons. The number of young deposited in this river the past few years has averaged less than 6,000 per season. By increasing the annual production to 100,000 or more it is reasonably certain that the peer of all fresh water food and game fishes would soon be established in Lake Superior and tributary waters in numbers sufficient to attract widespread attention and add very materially to the fishery resources of that section.

A small consignment of smelt eggs from New England waters was received at the Soo hatchery last spring and deposited in the St. Mary's River. This initial effort should be repeated for a number of years; or perhaps a better plan would be to transfer a carload or more of the adult fish from their native waters in New England. It is quite probable that this work would be taken up by the Bureau of Fisheries on application and a proper presentation of its potential importance. The introduction of fresh water smelt to serve as a specially desirable source of food supply for the adult salmon and other predaceous but valuable food fish is strongly indicated and recommended.

During the season of 1905 some preliminary steps were taken with a view to propagating small-mouth bass in connection with the regular work at the Soo station, but unexpected drafts in our current resources compelled the suspension of experimental work before results were due. The site chosen is a section of shoal water near the outlet of Duck Lake where small-mouth bass are known to resort for spawning purposes. This lake is located on an island in that part of St. Mary's River which is a natural home for the species.

In the fall of 1905 the outlet of this lake and the narrows some distance above were provided with screens, enclosing an area of four or five acres. As far as practical the predaceous fish were netted out of this enclosure and replaced with a stock of adult small-mouths. The lake was inspected the following summer, or during 1906, and considerable numbers of young bass were observed, but a shortage of funds prevented the completion of arrangements for their collection and distribution. This experiment should be carried to completion at the earliest opportunity, though it may take two or three seasons to determine whether young bass can be produced here in practical or profitable numbers.

The following improvements were made at the Soo station during the biennial period:

New 20-inch cast iron supply main from the Chandler-Dunbar power dam at head of pond system, with smaller connections and extensions, each provided with a gate valve. Most of the expense of installing the new 20-inch main was met by the power company to shift over to their new power pond.

One new storage pond 75x150, gravel bottom with concrete outlet wasting into tailrace from power dam.

Sixteen-inch waste for draining pond No. 5 into the rapids.

Four outside rearing troughs for fry.

One new alternating current motor, three-horse power.

One new centrifugal pump, capacity 120 gallons per minute.

One 16-inch and one 20-inch cast iron supply main through embankment of new power dam now under construction, for connection with present supply mains when the old power dam is abandoned.

The repairs and improvements recommended for the ensuing two years are as follows:

Painting hatchery outside and inside two coats. Has not been painted in eight years.

New roof and other current repairs to building. Present roof leaks badly in places and is practically beyond repair.

Extension of trolley line to foot of rapids, with small wharf at terminus and lighter for transferring supplies, materials and cans of fish. The construction work by the power companies and the Government will necessitate taking up the railroad spur connecting with our trolley line, compelling us to provide a new outlet and inlet for cans of fish, etc.

Small portable house, boats, nets, tanks and other equipment for bass experiments at Duck Lake.

The Soo hatchery is well equipped for hatching brook trout, rainbow trout, lake trout, wall-eyed pike, landlocked salmon and whitefish, but under present conditions it is not a desirable nor economical point for increasing our stock of adult trout for breeding purposes. The situation is such that the construction of additional ponds for brood fish is not warranted, at least for the present, or until the outcome of changes contemplated by power companies and the Government are more definitely known. It is, moreover, extremely doubtful whether it will ever pay to enlarge the pond facilities at this station, as the Electric Power Company's new tailrace outside of the pond area places the latter on a relatively higher level and cuts off the flow from the rapids. So long as

brook trout eggs can be purchased in sufficient numbers and at present prices, it will be more economical to buy than to produce them by adding more ponds to the Soo plant.

If there is a shortage in the available egg supply from private or outside sources, or if prices advance unduly, it will be in the line of economy as well as efficiency to develop storage ponds for trout elsewhere in the Upper Peninsula; this auxiliary or outside pond station not to be used as a hatchery but to grow and assemble a large stock of trout for producing eggs, to be transferred to the Soo hatchery for hatching and distribution.

It is quite probable that in the Upper Peninsula the most suitable facilities for economical production of eggs on a large scale will be found at a point more or less remote from railroads, but the disadvantages on this account are hardly worth considering in connection with a plant of this kind. A station for the convenient and economical distribution of thousands of cans of fish must necessarily be located near a railroad, but a pond plant solely for the production of eggs may be a considerable distance from a railroad point without adding perceptibly to the average cost per million. Two or three millions of eggs in shipping cases may be transferred by team to a shipping point at a single trip, whereas the same number of eggs advanced to the hatching point and delivered as young fish in cans would require twenty-five to forty trips.

There are, moreover, excellent reasons why a pond plant for brook trout should be located in a wild and somewhat inaccessible region. The character and volume of the water supply would not be subject to appreciable or untoward changes for a long term of years, while utility alone would govern in the work of development and maintenance. In such a location well-kept lawns, walks, driveways and frills of every kind would be wholly out of place, holding the construction and maintenance fund down to the lowest practical point consistent with the best results. It will be advisable, therefore, to investigate all promising locations, that may be known or brought to our attention, in order to be in a position to carry out the plan indicated, in the near future or whenever the necessary funds are available.

HARRIETTA STATION.

In volume and quality the water supply at Harrietta leaves little to be desired for the propagation of brook trout in large numbers. With a complete and well balanced equipment of ponds and races for the various sizes of fish, to the limit of the splendid water resources, the minimum annual production of brook trout eggs may safely be placed at 6,000,000 to 8,000,000. The annual output is now only about 1,500,000, but the stock of breeding fish is comparatively small. We have, in fact, only begun to utilize the resources that the situation affords. Funds have been limited and the lion's share has been used for the purchase and clearing of land, construction and equipment of buildings, and centralizing the numerous springs to bring them under control for a

systematic development of a pond and raceway system. These preliminary and collateral, though necessary, features being now mostly taken care of, future appropriations will have a more direct bearing on the actual egg producing development of the plant.

The special improvements at this station the past two years include but two important items, viz:

The construction of a series of four storage and spawning ponds, with connecting raceways, supplied from and discharging into Slagle Creek; and the construction of a canal intercepting the numerous springs south and east of the hatchery and delivering the flow to cleared grounds near the highway, at an elevation of about 15 feet above the main creek. This canal is 1,000 feet long and starts at the east line of the hatchery property, practically on a level with Slagle Creek. Any part or all of the latter may therefore be turned into the spring water canal and delivered to the pond area near the hatchery and highway.

The special improvements recommended for the ensuing biennial term are as follows:

First in importance is the construction of suitable races and ponds of sufficient capacity to produce 50,000 yearling trout each season for the next four or five years. This step is imperative if the collection of eggs at this station is to be rapidly and permanently increased.

A number of larger ponds must also be provided to carry forward the increasing stock of yearlings, but these will not be needed at present, unless the necessary facilities for turning out the above number of yearlings are put into commission the coming season.

Another stand of hatching boxes and trays is needed to accommodate the increasing collection of eggs.

The spring and creek water canal above referred to has not been fully completed. The bottom should be covered with gravel and the sides protected by piling or sodding, and a safe and permanent connection made with Slagle Creek.

A section of Slagle Creek and four or five acres of land adjoining the station property on the west side should be acquired at the earliest opportunity. An effort was made to buy this property at the time it was decided to locate at Harrietta, but a movement was then under way to dam the creek at this point for milling purposes and the price asked was prohibitive. Later the mill project was abandoned, hence the lands and flowage rights involved are now offered for sale at a greatly reduced price. On acquiring these rights we can provide more satisfactory drainage for the lower ponds and utilize them to better advantage in every way, while the land below is suitable for pond service.

DRAYTON PLAINS STATION.

The propagation of small-mouth bass has been carried on at this station for four seasons. The past two seasons the work was a partial failure, and it is quite possible that the species will not reproduce here in profitable numbers every year. The first year hatching results

were successful and encouraging; approximately 100,000 small-mouth bass were hatched in two ponds, but this record has not since been equalled. A careful examination of the spawning beds the past two seasons has shown that a considerable percentage of the eggs were unfertilized, while the fertile eggs on some beds seemed to lack sufficient vitality to survive to the hatching point. The average percentage of hatching results was therefore low and unsatisfactory.

No special difficulty, however, has been experienced in rearing normal or healthy small-mouth fry to suitable shipping size—half fingerling to fingerling; this feature is neither difficult nor uncertain under conditions that to a great extent may be controlled or provided for. The number that may be so advanced, likewise the rate of growth, varies greatly in corresponding pond areas, but satisfactory rearing results are nevertheless certain and the percentage quite uniform if the ponds are stocked proportionately to the supply of natural food and the young fish are later thinned out promptly as required to meet the changing food conditions.

The period of uncertainty in the production of small-mouths at this station precedes the hatching and feeding stage. Hatching results cannot be forecast with any degree of confidence or certainty under apparently favorable conditions. This has proven the most serious and perplexing problem that has developed in the cultivation of the species. However, the initiative in the propagation of small-mouth bass at Drayton is of such recent date that the outlook is far from discouraging. There is still much room for observation and investigation of the conditions that control or affect hatching results. Careful experimental work should therefore be continued here, limited to two ponds, until the average production of fry per bed is established on a reliable and profitable basis.

The propagation of large-mouth bass at Drayton continues to be successful and satisfactory. The output of advanced fry and fingerlings the past season was approximately a quarter of a million, a substantial increase over any preceding season and a creditable showing in view of the limited pond area available for rearing purposes. The production of these fish at this station is merely a question of pond room, which should be greatly increased at the earliest practical date.

Large-mouth bass rank with the small-mouth as a food fish, and nearly every lake and pond in the State is well adapted to their propagation and maintenance. In many of our lakes, however, the natural supply has been greatly reduced by over-fishing, hence the demand for young bass for restocking purposes has increased far beyond our present resources of supply. Moreover the introduction of the young fish into these depleted but indigenous waters is not in the nature of an experiment; it is certain to be followed by substantial results. It is evident, therefore, that the situation with reference to large-mouth bass opens up a wide and inviting field for effective and profitable fish-cultural effort that demands greatly increased resources.

The main item of special improvements during the past two seasons was the construction of three rearing ponds. One of these ponds

is 125x150 feet and each of the other two is 162x240. The sandy and barren parts of the bottoms of these ponds were enriched with a layer of muck, and chara was introduced by transplanting. A satisfactory though not luxuriant growth of the latter developed last season, and these ponds were quite fertile in the production of the small animal life that serves as food for the young bass.

The following improvements are recommended for the ensuing biennial term:

About 600 feet of sewer to divert the surplus from Judd's Creek during freshets. This creek flows through the ponds recently constructed. Ordinarily the volume is insignificant but freshets in June are a menace to the outlet screens which at that time must necessarily be of fine mesh to retain the young bass confined for rearing.

Two hundred and fifty rods of fence to enclose the station grounds. All line fences are to be constructed by the Board, as the ordinary legal fence will not properly safeguard the ponds and station property.

New barn. The little one-story shack that was on the premises when acquired is too small and wholly unfit for barn uses.

Additional ponds for rearing bass, perch and bluegills to fingerling size. The output from the station plant can be increased materially only as more pond room is provided. This is of even greater importance than increasing the productive facilities of the trout stations, as trout may be bought while bass cannot.

MILL CREEK STATION.

Owing to the heavy floods in 1905 and adverse weather conditions during the breeding season of 1906, the production of small-mouth bass was light during these two seasons.

The spawning and hatching in May, 1905, was successful, yielding a sufficient number of young to stock all of the rearing ponds near the hatchery to their capacity for growing the fry to fingerling size. The fish were advancing rapidly, the early hatch being nearly ready for shipping when on the night of June 6th a series of cloudbursts created a flood of unprecedented volume in Mill Creek, sweeping over the ponds and carrying away practically all of the stock of small-mouth bass both old and young. The precipitation was greater by a considerable margin than has occurred in a like period since a station of the Weather Bureau was established at Grand Rapids, and all high water records at Mill Creek were broken.

In the following spring, or 1906, the outlook for a largely increased hatch of small-mouths was unusually bright on the opening of the spawning season. Warm weather in April and early May induced free and successful spawning, but a touch of genuine March weather returned for a few days and all of the spawn deposited at that time was destroyed. On May 7th a snow storm and unseasonably severe weather lowered the water temperature to 47, a new record for the season at this station, and probably several degrees below the fatal point for bass eggs. A limited number of small-mouth breeders delayed spawn-

ing until after the cold spell and all of the fry collected from these later hatchings were reserved for rearing to fingerling size.

A much larger proportion of large-mouth bass spawned after the cold weather referred to, both in the station ponds and outside rented waters, resulting in a substantial and satisfactory increase in the output over any preceding season. The production of half-fingerling and fingerling large-mouths was especially gratifying, the output of 1906 being double that of 1905, due in part to the completion of a large rearing pond in time for service in '06.

A sudden change to severe weather may occur any year during the early part of the spawning season and seriously affect hatching results at this station, but the water and food conditions can hardly be surpassed for a rapid growth of a relatively large number of the young. Mill Creek drains a large area of cultivated land and the early summer rains wash down a wealth of food producing material. The ponds soon choke with vegetation and in early summer both creek and ponds are literally clouded at times with swarming myriads of minute crustacean forms, chiefly *daphnia*. The situation and conditions are nearly perfect for a certain and rapid growth of the young to a stage or size that enables them to disperse and elude their enemies when transferred to strange waters. The fingerling capacity of each pond, however, has a limit, hence the urgent necessity of providing additional pond area on land adjoining the present ponds.

A continuance of the plan of propagating large-mouth bass in private natural waters within convenient distance of Mill Creek is recommended. Collections of young from these waters are made during the schooling stage only, as it is not practical to effect their capture in profitable numbers after the schools have dispersed. They are not taken in the earlier stages, however, but when well advanced toward the scattering point. The advanced fry and small fingerlings are either shipped at once direct to applicants or placed in the station ponds for further growth.

In proportion to water area and the number of breeding bass, results in the form of advanced fry do not, of course, compare with production in the protected and controlled station ponds. Still when operated as a side or incidental feature of an established central plant the average cost per thousand fry collected in this way is low; the only expense items involved are rent, collecting and transferring the breeders, posting notices, and collecting and transferring the young to a shipping or rearing point. Five of these natural ponds are now under lease in connection with the Mill Creek bass work.

Recently a private water of considerable area, perhaps 12 to 15 acres in extent and known as Lambertson's Lake, was leased at an annual rental of \$25.00. This lake contains no grass pike, gars nor dogfish, and it is recommended that it be used for the propagation of perch and perhaps bluegills. In the absence of the larger predatory species and with fishing entirely prohibited, perch and bluegills multiply rapidly. This lake, therefore, affords a favorable opportunity for turning out a considerable number of the young and at a nominal expense up to the point of collection and distribution. There is a constantly increasing demand for these common but desirable food fish, to restock waters

that have been depleted through excessive fishing, chiefly resort lakes near urban centers, such as Reed's Lake near Grand Rapids, Goguac Lake near Battle Creek, and Orchard and other lakes near Pontiac.

One of the smaller ponds at Mill Creek should also be stocked with perch breeders for experimental work in hatching and rearing. Perhaps the most successful plan for the propagation of perch in controlled ponds is to arrange a row of brush around the margin to catch and suspend the ribbons of spawn and prevent them from settling to the bottom. Under favorable conditions a good hatching percentage is assured from the strips caught and held by the twigs and branches, or a still better percentage by transferring the ribbons to ordinary hatching jars. The latter plan is preferable, in fact necessary, if the young are to be assembled in tanks for immediate distribution.

The bluegill is a bed protector and its spawning habits are practically identical with the large-mouth bass, though the beds are made in shoaler water, usually in a depth of 6 to 15 inches. The propagation of bluegills in protected ponds containing no other kinds or sizes of fish to prey on the young is practical, but as our pond room for rearing bass is still far short of actual requirements, it will be advisable for the present to confine the bluegill work at Mill Creek to leased natural waters.

The main items of improvement at Mill Creek for the past two seasons are as follows:

Concrete wall along bank of creek to protect ponds from floods. This wall is 440 feet long and 11 feet high, over all. The base is 4 feet wide by 1 foot thick and the wall proper 2 feet thick at the bottom, tapering to 6 inches at the top, with a cap 6 inches thick by 12 inches wide.

About 300 feet of sheet piling at dangerous points below the wall, to prevent banks from washing, made of 2x6 hemlock, set with a pile driver and stayed by cables attached to anchors imbedded in the bank.

One rearing pond 330 feet long by 125 feet wide, banks rip-rapped with small cobble stones.

One pond 12 feet wide and 65 feet long, concrete sides and bottom, for experiments in rearing young bass on artificial food.

Four hundred ninety-two feet of wire fence, 6 feet high, on west side of grounds, and 354 feet of 4-ft. fence on the south side.

About one-third mile of graveled driveway, 10 feet wide, and 495 feet of graveled walk, 4 feet wide.

Eight new inlets and 2 new outlets; also 315 feet of waste tiling from Pond No. 1 to the creek.

Grading, re-sodding, etc., to repair damage by flood.

New foot bridge across creek.

Repairs to dam and supply main connecting same with ponds.

The cost of the new concrete wall and other improvements and repairs on account of the disastrous flood in June, 1905, was about \$800 in excess of the special appropriation therefor. Several repair items provided for in the regular appropriation were therefore necessarily passed over. Without placing any money value on the loss of fish, the actual property damage by the flood was approximately \$2,200, according to the engineer's survey. No doubt this sum would have restored the

plant to its former status, but additional safeguards were necessary to prevent similar disasters in the future.

The main repair and special improvement items recommended for the ensuing biennial term are as follows:

About 1300 feet of 16 or 18 inch water pipe for supplying the station ponds. The present supply main is a 12-inch wood pipe, too small for the purpose and decayed beyond repair. It was second-hand pipe when laid, having been in service many years for the Grand Rapids Water Board. The first appropriation for the Mill Creek station being absurdly small, a "bargain counter" supply main was the best that could be afforded. The condition of this main is a constant menace to the safety of the work; it is liable to give out any time and shut off the only available supply for the hatchery and ponds except a flow of spring water not exceeding 25 gallons per minute.

New hatchery and equipment. The present building is a small cheap affair, in bad repair and poorly and inadequately equipped. It was the best that could be built with the meager appropriation allowed when the station was established, but the work has outgrown its capacity and there is no room to expand or increase the building facilities for young fish. Additional buildings are needed anyway for other purposes and with slight alterations the old hatchery may be utilized to good advantage as a general workshop.

Sheet piling along west bank of the creek from bridge to limit of station grounds. Stretches of piling have already been driven at the most dangerous or more exposed points but the gaps should be closed in like manner, as the open or unprotected sections of the pond banks are washed and menaced by every flood.

Additional land and construction of ponds on same. Ten acres of valley land suitable for ponds and adjoining the present station limits above and below should be acquired and developed at the earliest practical date. All pond room and lands now owned are utilized, hence the output must remain practically at a standstill until additional ponds are put into commission. The pressing demand for an early expansion of facilities in this direction is apparent from the fact that unfulfilled applications for bass for 500 to 1,000 lakes and rivers are carried over every season, while the number of fish in each delivery made is seldom more than 10 to 25 per cent of the actual requirements.

Storage shed and addition to barn. Besides the superintendent's residence there are only three buildings on the premises—the hatchery, barn and icehouse—and all of the latter are too small for their respective purposes. Most of the larger portable equipment that should be housed when not in service stands exposed to the weather. Additional room is needed for wagons, wheelbarrows, bass-beds, fry retainers, seines, hay, tools, shipping cans, surplus lumber, and other materials.

DETROIT STATION.

This station is leased to the Bureau of Fisheries for the propagation of whitefish, with the right of occupancy and use reserved to the State for propagating wall-eyed pike and other spring spawning species. As

whitefish spawn in the fall and hatch in the spring, our work follows that of the Bureau without interference or conflict. The same hatching equipment also serves all requirements, hence the arrangement under which this station has been operated for the past eight seasons has proven most satisfactory and advantageous to both the State and the Federal Bureau.

The lease of the Detroit station provides that all repairs to building and equipment shall be made by the Bureau. This feature has been well taken care of; in fact the permanent property is in better condition than it was eight years ago when the Bureau assumed control. During the past two years the building was reshingled and painted outside two coats, and most of the floor in the hatching and tank rooms was relaid with concrete.

As compensation in part for the use of the Detroit and Soo stations for hatching commercial fish, the Bureau turns over to the State 30,000,000 to 45,000,000 eyed eggs of wall-eyed pike each season, the delivery being made early in May. About 50 per cent of these eggs are hatched and distributed from Detroit, 35 per cent from Mill Creek and 15 per cent from the Soo. Formerly it was the practice to distribute the entire output of pike from the hatchery at Detroit, but the season is too short to successfully cover all parts of the State from one shipping point. Wall-eyed pike must be shipped practically as fast as hatched to insure safe delivery, hence the distribution season is short and strenuous, averaging about 16 days at Mill Creek and Detroit. The service is therefore much improved under the present plan.

The propagation of yellow perch at this station should be taken up at the earliest date that funds can be spared to carry on the work. The eggs may be collected in connection with commercial fishing in Saginaw Bay, also near Port Huron, the spawning season averaging a few days later than the season for wall-eyed pike. The young fish would necessarily have to be shipped as fast as hatched, the same as wall-eyed pike.

CAR AND DISTRIBUTION SERVICE.

The delivery of fish to applicants has been made chiefly by the State car "Fontinalis," though a considerable percentage of the output is handled in baggage cars of regular trains, in charge of hatchery messengers or car messengers detached from the fish car at central or connecting points. Small shipments are also occasionally placed in care of regular train baggagemen for short runs, when the fish require no special attention and the applicant has wired or 'phoned notice that cans will be met. For several seasons past we have also been forced to put an extra car in service—a baggage or express car borrowed or rented from some railroad company. This extra service usually covers a period of 20 to 30 days during the height of the spring delivery season when heavy distributions are being made from two or three hatcheries at the same time.

No serious losses of fish have occurred in transit during the past two

seasons, and with few unimportant exceptions they have been delivered in good condition. An extra supply of fresh water is carried when convenient and necessary, but aeration and the use of ice to temper and refresh are mainly or wholly depended on to keep the fish in good condition while on the road. Oxygen is reintroduced as required by hand-pouring and jetting with hand-pumps. Two devices of recent invention for recharging water with oxygen, viz: the Leach aerating dipper and the Brass aerating tube, were used to some extent the past season and with excellent results.

Repeated attention has been called to the need of a new distributing car to replace the "Fontinalis." This car has been in service since 1888. Its frame was too light in the first place and the timbers were insufficiently braced and strengthened. It was partly rebuilt about twelve years ago but later was permanently weakened in a wreck that threw both body and trucks down a steep embankment. The "Fontinalis" may perhaps be repaired and strengthened so as to answer our purpose for two or three years, but a new car should be provided not later than 1909 or 1910, after which the old car should be used only for extra or supplemental trips when two cars are required at the same time.

During the winter of 1905 all of the shipping cans owned by the Board were assembled at Paris and painted two coats, renumbered and restenciled. A distinctive color—a bright red—was used to reduce the chances of confusion and exchange with milk cans while returning empty through hands of baggagemen. Later the inside of all galvanized or discolored cans was given two coats of Bathtub Enamel, the first and only satisfactory preparation of the kind we have found that resists hot water. This enamel not only prevents rusting but reflects sufficient light to bring the fish clearly into view, whether near the surface or on the bottom, a distinct advantage to the distribution service.

The estimates for the next two years include 150 new shipping cans, though we really need at least 500 more during the spring rush. For a number of seasons we have been obliged to borrow 300 or 400 cans from the Bureau of Fisheries and to shift and transfer our own back and forth from one station to another. The Bureau, however, may not be in a position to spare its cans every season, in which event our distribution service would be badly crippled.

The statistics for 1905 are now being collected. These statistics cannot be taken until 1905 has expired, or until January, 1906, and cannot be completed and tabulated in time for this report.

It will be seen by this report that more fish were taken in 1903 than in 1902, and more in 1904 than in 1903. There has been a corresponding increase in the number of nets used.

If the capture of immature whitefish and lake trout could be stopped entirely the increase in the quantity of these fish taken would be surprising. If the practice of taking these immature fish is continued an increase can hardly be hoped for, in fact, nothing but the work of the hatcheries can prevent an alarming decrease.

If rigid and complete enforcement of the laws were possible favorable results would soon appear in the largely increased quantity of mature fish taken.
