Species Description

13,400 Wild Rose strain yearling brown trout are stocked into Lime Lake each year. No natural reproduction occurs, however, survival of the stocked fish is good and multiple year classes are typically present in the lake.

Noteworthy

Lime Lake tends to create a better ice fishery than open water fishery, although trout can certainly be caught in the summer months. Lime Lake has a steep drop off, with the deepest portion of the lake reaching approximately 65 feet. The lake is best fished with a small boat during open water and is very difficult to wade.

Fishing Regulations

Lime Lake is designated a Type C trout lake. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Lake Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

From Traverse City head west on M-72 to County Road 667 (Maple City Hwy). Turn right and head north. Proceed through the intersection in Maple City and the boat launch will be approximately 5 miles north of the intersection on the right.
