Species Description

Most brown trout encountered at this location will be from 7-10 inches in length with some fish reaching up to 13 inches in length. Some brook trout can be found in the vicinity of Eighteen Mile Creek.

Noteworthy

The river in this area is mostly low gradient with frequent meanders and a width and depth of 45 and 2.5 feet, respectively. Pools are generally 5-7 feet in depth.

Fishing Regulations

The Sturgeon River in this area is designated a Type 4 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

From the intersection of US-2 and Forest Highway 13, travel north on Forest Highway 13 for approximately 6.75 miles. Turn left (west) onto Forest Road 2229 and proceed for approximately 0.8 miles. The river will be located on the right (north) and a USFS gravel pit on the left (south).
