

## Historical Marker - S491 - Charles T. Gorham (Marker ID#:S491)



### Front - Title/Description

#### **Charles T. Gorham**

Gorham (1812-1901) came to Marshall in 1836 from New York State. First a merchant, he became a banker and in 1865 organized the First National Bank of Marshall, now the Michigan National Bank. He was a defendant in the famous Crosswhite fugitive slave case. A vice-president of the first Republican Convention at Jackson in 1854, Gorham later was a state senator. During the 1870s he served the United States as minister to the Netherlands and then as assistant secretary of the interior.
