### ***Fish Species***

Brook Trout; Steelhead

### ***Species Description***

The Brook Trout population in the Rock River is entirely natural. Brook Trout natural reproduction is good and growth is excellent with fish reaching sizes up to 15 inches. Most Brook Trout caught are from 7-10 inches in length. Occasionally, steelhead can be caught in the spring.

### ***Noteworthy***

This section of the Rock River is very sandy with dense woody debris throughout. As you get away from the easy access points an angler will find deeper holding pools and structure. Tag alders will make the experience a bit of a challenge, but worth the extra effort when successful. Anglers use spinners and worms primarily for Brook Trout, while steelhead anglers use spawn.

### ***Fishing Regulations***

The Rock River in the area of Rock River Road Bridge is a designated Type 1 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Salmon and Trout Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

### ***Directions to Site***

Located just north of Chatham, this site on the Rock River can be accessed heading north on Rock River Rd. (H-01). Follow H-01 for about 3 miles to the bridge crossing the Rock River. Pull off and park along road shoulder. Access can be made in any direction as this is all U.S. National Forest property.
