Fish Species

Brook Trout; Steelhead

Species Description

A good number of wild brook trout exist in this river. Anglers report good catches of fish frequently reaching 15 inches. When steelhead are in the Two Hearted River, some will hit the East Branch.

Noteworthy

While fishing this river anglers can find deep holes and plenty of overhead cover for big trout. The most successful anglers will use natural bait. Wading is possible but most anglers will fish the river from the bank. The river meanders through stands of mature red and white pine trees making tag alder spotty in most reaches. This river is a really tranquil setting for most anglers seeking some nice Brook Trout.

Fishing Regulations

The East Branch of the Two Hearted River at this location is a designated Type 1 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide for details.

Directions to Site

This site is north of the Village of Newberry. Drive north on M-123 to Four Mile Corner (County Road 407) and make a left (West). Follow County Road (CR) 407 for about 15 miles to CR 414 and make a right (East). Follow CR 414 to the intersection with CR 410 and make a right (East) staying on CR 414. The bridge crossing to the East Branch of the Two Hearted River is about a half mile up the road. Parking is available alongside of the road or in the small pull off area.
