Rainbow Trout

Species Description

Eagle Lake strain yearling rainbow trout are stocked annually. These stocked rainbows survive very well and grow to lengths upwards of 17 inches. Fish averaged a length of 13.5 inches during a 2014 survey.

Noteworthy

Pratt Lake is located within the Pretty Lakes Complex. This complex of lakes is governed by a no motors restriction, both gas and electric motors are prohibited. Most anglers fish this lake with Kayaks or float tubes. Pratt Lake can be fished from shore in many places as the drop-off to deeper water is well within a cast's reach. Anglers can also access Sid Lake from the same parking area of Pratt Lake by using a footpath heading to the east. Sid Lake offers Brook Trout fishing.

Fishing Regulations

Pratt Lake is a designated Type A trout lake. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Lake regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

This location is North of the village of Newberry. Drive North on M-123 to Four Mile Corner (County Road 407) and turn left. Follow County Road (CR) 407 for about 17 miles to CR 416 and turn left (West). Continue on CR 416 past Holland Lake and Pretty Lake for 3.5 miles to Poplar Camp Road. Turn left (South) onto Poplar Camp Road and go about 1.2 miles to Pratt Lake Access on the left hand side of the road. Parking here should be adequate for the limited amount of traffic Pratt Lake receives.
