SALE STATISTICS

Volumes were calculated in cubic feet using the Michigan taper model. Cubic foot volume includes all wood inside bark for the product indicated. For display purposes, cubic feet were converted to cords and MBF using a simple conversion factor, e.g. 79 cubic feet per cord and 185 cubic feet per MBF. The cubic foot volumes are precise; the cords and MBF volumes are not. Cubic foot volume cannot be directly converted to cords or boards with precision.

1 - Sale Area

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (9/19)

The sale boundary and Payment Unit boundaries are marked and identified by red and yellow paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against state land are marked with red paint. Interior Payment Unit boundaries are marked with yellow paint, except the boundary between Payment Units 1 and 2 is marked with red paint as marked on the Timber Sale Map. Retention patches are marked with double red paint marks; no harvesting activities may occur within these areas. The painted boundary line trees are not Included Timber and are to be protected unless marked with orange paint.

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.1 - Clearcut unit(s) with unmerchantable trees (6/14)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1 and 4, cut all trees that are two (2) inches or more at DBH, except for any trees marked with green paint. In addition,

- Within Payment Unit 1: do not cut any white oak;

- Within Payment Unit 4: do not cut any red pine unless marked with orange paint, any white pine greater than 18" at DBH, or any oak. Maple and pine saplings (less than 4.6" at DBH) may be left standing if undamaged.

2.1.2 - Clearcut unit(s) w/o unmerchantable trees (8/11)

Within Payment Unit(s) 2 and 7, cut all trees which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization, except for oaks or any trees marked with green paint. Do not cut any witch hazel or juneberry.

2.1.3 - Cut tree marked unit(s) (12/08)

Within Payment Unit(s) 3 and 5, all trees are designated for cutting when marked with orange paint above and below stump height, regardless of merchantability.

2.1.7 - Leave tree marked unit(s) (6/14)

Within Payment Unit(s) 6, all trees, which meet minimum piece specifications in 2.2 Utilization, are designated for cutting except trees marked with green paint above and below stump height.

4 - Transportation

4.1 - Construction

4.1.6 - Road construction (1/09)

Construction of new roads or improvements of existing roads shall be done in such a way as to minimize the environmental and visual impacts. Merchantable trees shall be cut and utilized unless otherwise directed. Non-merchantable trees shall be severed and laid flat on the ground. Slash shall be scattered, and not left in windrows and kept a minimum of 10 feet back from the road edge. Stumps shall be set upright, not left on edge, and be moved at least 30 feet away from the road edge. Disturbed soil shall be feathered into the woods and not left in berms or windrows.

4.1.7 - Road closure (10/11)

All new roads built into the sale must be blocked to vehicle traffic upon completion of the sale. In general, this will require constructing a four (4') foot high berm of stumps and logs covered with earth. All stumps from road building and landing construction must be reserved to block any newly constructed roads upon completion of the sale. These stumps must be scattered along the road system to prohibit vehicular movement. Contact the sale administrator for specific details of design and placement.

4.1.8 - Road work (1) (8/07)

The following road work is required: On the "Sale Access Route" shown on the Timber Sale Map through Payment Units 3 and 4, the Purchaser must ditch and crown a 150-yard-long portion of this road plus several other short stretches as

designated by the sale administrator. After initial reshaping, the Purchaser is required to purchase and spread at least 200 cubic yards of pit run gravel with maximum stone size of 6 inches in diameter. Alternatively for the 150-yard portion of road the Purchaser may reroute that portion to adjacent higher ground as approved by the timber sale administrator and cap that stretch with 23A crushed gravel at least 4" deep and 10' wide. Gravel placement will be as designated by the sale administrator.

4.4 - Access

4.4.4 - Restricted access (10/05)

Payment Units 1 and 2 must be accessed via the existing forest road running north from Blair Townhall Road. Access via Freedom Road will not be allowed to avoid conflicts with other users and resource values.

5 - Operations

5.2 - Conduct of Operations

5.2.1 - Slash

5.2.1.8 - Slash height (12/08) No slash or tree tops may exceed 24 inches in height.

5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

5.2.3.3 - Bark slippage restriction (3/09)

Within Payment Unit(s) 3 and 5, unless changed by written agreement, cutting and skidding are not permitted during the period of April 15 to July 15. This restriction is because of bark slippage.

5.2.3.4 - Oak wilt restriction, no exceptions (1/18)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1, 2, 4, 6, and 7, cutting, skidding, hauling within the sale and brushing of access roads to the sale are not permitted during the period of April 15 to July 15. No exceptions will be granted. This is necessary to reduce the spread of oak wilt.

5.2.3.6 - Bark beetle restriction (12/08)

In the event drought creates a high risk of pine bark beetle infestation, pine is not to be cut during the period March 1 through July 1, unless all portions of trees greater than two inches in diameter are removed from the sale area, reduced to chips, or treated to the satisfaction of the Unit Manager or his/her representative, within fifteen days of being severed from the stump. Pine log decks, pulpwood piles and treetops that are piled for chipping in the fall or winter within a 1/4 mile of susceptible sites must be removed before March 15. Residual slash must not be placed in piles or rows and must be spread over the site for quick drying. The Department of Natural Resources will exercise this specification if the risk of damage warrants.

5.2.4 - Dead and Down Creation

5.2.4.1 - Dead and down creation, marked trees (10/13)

All trees marked with an orange "X" must be felled and left on site for wildlife. Either cut these trees at 4 feet above ground level and place the cut trunk against the resulting high stump or cut at ground level and place the cut trunk against a small nearby tree retained for this purpose.

5.2.22 - Operating Caution

5.2.22.1 - Operating caution (6/11)

It is recommended, but not required, that within Payment Unit(s) 3-5, cutting, skidding, and hauling occur during dry summer or frozen winter conditions. The reason for the recommendation is because soil may be saturated in these Payment Units during wet periods, resulting in a high risk of rutting.

5.2.38 - No decking against live trees (2/04)

Cut products may not be decked against unmarked or designated leave trees.

5.3 - Stream Protection

5.3.1 - Operating near stream (7/04)

No tracked or wheeled vehicles shall be operated within 50 feet of Jaxon Creek (west of Payment Units 1 and 6, as shown on the Timber Sale Map). Timber sale operation in this area may not go beyond the painted timber sale boundaries.

5.4 - Soil Protection

5.4.6 - Wet area protection (5/10)

No harvesting operations, including skidding and felling, are to take place within the "N" types to the southeast of Payment Unit 6. All equipment, trees and tops should be kept out of this area. Care must be taken by the Purchaser to identify and avoid operating in these areas of the timber sale.

6 - Safety and Fire Prevention

6.2 - Signing

6.2.1 - Road posting (10/20)

The Purchaser is responsible for posting and maintaining caution signs on Blair Townhall Road prior to beginning operations. The road must be posted approximately 350 feet from the Sale Area to warn of logging activity and truck traffic. Signs must be removed when harvest operations are suspended or completed. The Purchaser will provide these signs.
