

COUNTY SURVEYOR'S RECORD.

OCEANA COUNTY.

Town 15 North, Range 15 West.

Sept
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A plot and record of a subdivision of Sec 10, beginning at the N. E. Cor. thence S 46° W. 10.06 chs to where a bush shaped boulder 16 inches long, 9 wide with "W" marked on west side and "E" on the East side. Thence S. 88 1/2° W. 39. 88 1/2 links to quarter corner at which place we sank a large boulder. Thence S 88 1/2° W. 15 1/2 chs a humlock stump, well marked as being a "sight tree" and also mentioned in the government field notes. Thence S 89° W. 23. 89 chs to the N. W. Cor. Drive post where a witness tree stood. As the distances and amount of each parcel are given in the plot we shall record only the corners on this page.

1. A conical shaped boulder 12 inches long, and 6 by 4 wide with smaller ones on the West side.

2. A piece of a jug and a broken can from which Elm 14 inches in diam. bears N 58° E 42 chs

3. Post from which Elm 24 inches in diameter bears N 6 links
Elm 10 inches in diam. bears S 88° W. 18 links.

4. Post from which Pine 6 inches diam. bears South 40° E. 5 links.
Samerack 6 inches in diameter bears S. 85 1/2° W 13 1/4 chs.

5. Post from which maple 10 in. Diameter bears South 9° E. 27 links
Beech 6 " " " " N 75° W. 25 "

6. Post from which cedar Elm 7 inches in diameter bears S 78 1/2° E 39 links

7. Cedar post from which Elm 6 inches in diameter bears N 23° W. 27 links.
Cedar 12 inches in diameter bears S 3° E. 26 links.

8. Post from which Beech 10 inches in diameter bears N 55° E. 50 links.
Horn. 8 inches in diameter S. 56° W. 80 links.

9. A large Boulder.

10. A boulder about 12 inches long, and rather roundish. We note this from memory. Said corner is 3.98 chs. west from a humlock stump, the stump and the North West corner of said section.

11. A cedar post driven down while the stumps of the witness trees were standing. I caused the post to be driven.

12. Post from which Beech 14 inches in diameter bears N 86° E. 60 links.
Horn 18 in " " " " N 60° W 56 "

13. A post, and as there were no witness object near we did not take any.
