SURVEY PRIORITY JUSTIFICATION

1. Is litigation involved now or being threatened? Explain:

There may be a possibility of a trespass.

2. If trespass is on state land, is the survey likely to prevent further trespass and harm, or is it to prove trespass? Explain:

Both. There is a possibility of a trespass that occurred when the adjacent landowner had their property thinned.

3. Is prevention of access to a significant area of state land involved? Explain:

4. Will a survey allow harvest of timber that is being held from the market due to survey problems? What is the value of the proposed sale? Explain (i.e., give the compartment, year of entry, timber condition, etc.):

The stands that are being held up due to survey make up roughly 70 acres.

Stand 40 is a mixed Oak/Aspen stand with fair to good quality timber. Valued roughly at \$30-\$40,000. There is heavy oak mortality in the SW corner that needs to be salvaged and will have to wait until a survey is complete.

Stand 36 is an aspen, pine stand with fair quality timber. Valued roughly \$20-30,000.

5. Are there reasonable alternatives to a survey that will allow at least a partial or temporary solution? (Example: Reduce size of the sale, agreement with or notification of adjacent landowner until proper survey can be done, establish line yourself, etc.) Explain:

No survey will result in reduction of harvestable acres. By establishing these survey corners, it will allow us to continue to actively manage these areas into the future.

6. Other:

A large pocket of Oak decline was found in stand 40 near the property line. Prolonging this treatment could result in more decline and loss of value in the large mature Oaks.
