PROSPECTUS NOTE: The IR Test Hardwood sale (52-105-12-01) has special requirements related to Payment Units (PUs) 1 and 2. An on-site meeting can be arranged to discuss these requirements. The DNR is conducting a test comparing different methods of measuring trees and determining tree volume. PUs 1 and 2 contain test areas. Both test areas have 20 test plots, i.e. there is roughly one test plot per acre. "Cut" and "Leave" trees have been numbered at each plot. Certain "Cut" trees on each test plot must be felled and cut into product lengths when DNR staff is present. Additional cuts above the last pulp stick may also be required. DNR staff will then make detailed measurements of each tree. There are 90 measurement trees in PU 1 and 72 measurement trees in PU 2.

The bidder is advised to inspect the sale area and review the location, estimated volumes, operating costs and contract terms of proposed sales. Please be aware that some landowners may request 60 days or more notice for access across their land.

2. Bidder's Qualifications (2/12)

Purchaser shall obtain workers compensation insurance to cover claims under Michigan's Worker's Disability Compensation Act of 1969 or similar employee benefit act of any other state applicable to an employee. If all or part of a timber sale was prepared by a private contractor, that contractor and that contractor's company are not permitted to bid on the timber sale contract. Bids will not be accepted from individuals or companies appearing on the DNR/FRD No-Bid List. This list contains the names of purchasers who previously failed to execute a contract within 21-days or who have a history of poor performance.

3. Preparation of Sealed Bids (1/11)

Bids shall be manually signed in ink; bid prices must be entered for each species and product in the Bid Price column for all material subject to bidding; and all fill-in blanks must be completed. If erasures or other changes appear on the forms, each erasure or change must be initialed by the person signing the bid.

4. Submission of Sealed Bids (6/11)

Bid forms may be obtained from the Unit Manager. All bids must be submitted on the bid form and in an envelope clearly identified as described in this section. 10. Disclaimer of Estimates and Bidder's Warranty of Inspection (1/11)

11. Certification and Chain-of-Custody (10/11)

Unless otherwise indicated in the contract under section 7 – Other Conditions of the Sale Specific Conditions & Requirements, the area encompassed by this timber sale is certified to the standards of the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) - Certificate #SCS-FM/COC-00090N and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative (SFI) - Certificate # NSF-SFIS-5Y031-S1. 1 - Sale Area

1.2 - Boundaries

1.2.1 - Painted boundaries (12/08)

The sale boundary and Payment Unit boundaries are marked and identified by blue, red and yellow paint. The east side of Unit 1 is bounded by trenches and the south side by a two-track and pink ribbon. Exterior sale boundary lines against private property are marked with blue paint. Exterior sale boundary lines against state are marked with red paint. Interior Payment Unit boundaries are marked with yellow paint. Yellow painted trees designating an interior Payment Unit boundary are only to be cut when all surrounding Payment Units have been paid.

2 - Timber Specifications

2.1 - Included Timber

2.1.1 - Clearcut unit(s) with unmerchantable trees (8/11)

Within Payment Unit(s) 1A, 1B, and 2B, cut all trees that are two (2) inches or more in diameter measured at a point four and one-half (4-1/2) feet above ground level regardless of merchantability. Unit 1A has a small amount of merchantable trees and a lot of cherry brush. Everything, including the brush must be cut to facilitate re-planting.

Unit 2A contains no merchantable timber. There are however scattered piles of tops that may be chipped and hauled.

2.1.11 - Description of timber note (2/04)

Note that payment unit 1A contains very little merchantable timber and is being sold on a per acre basis as miscellaneous pulp. All trees and brush must be cut.

2.2 - Utilization

2.2.2 - Chipping required (1/11)

This sale must be chip harvested to facilitate subsequent planting operations. The purchaser has the option to produce sawlogs or pulpwood bolts, but the remaining portion of the trees must be chipped and hauled. 4.2 - Maintenance

4.2.5 - Two wheel drive condition (2/04)

All existing trail roads on and adjacent to the sale area must be passable by two-wheel drive traffic for the duration of the sale.

5 - Operations

5.1 - Notification

5.1.1 - Pre-sale conference (10/11)

A pre-sale conference on site between the Purchaser and sale administrator is required prior to beginning any operations to determine landing and road locations. The Unit Manager or his/her representative must be contacted at least 3 days in advance to schedule the conference.

5.2 - Conduct of Operations

5.2.1 - Slash

5.2.1.1 - Slash within sale area (2/04)

No trees are to be felled outside the sale area and all slash is to be kept at least 10 feet back from the blue paint line.

5.2.3 - Operating Restrictions

5.2.3.6 - Bark beetle restriction (12/08)

In the event drought creates a high risk of pine bark beetle infestation, pine is not to be cut during the period March 1 through July 1, unless all portions of trees greater than two inches in diameter are removed from the sale area, reduced to chips, or treated to the satisfaction of the Unit Manager or his/her representative, within fifteen days of being severed from the stump. Pine log decks, pulpwood piles and treetops that are piled for chipping in the fall or winter within a 1/4 mile of susceptible sites must be removed before March 15. Residual slash must not be placed in piles or rows and must be spread over the site for quick drying. The Department of Natural Resources will exercise this specification if the risk of damage warrants.

5.2.39 - ORV trail/route protection (1/09)

The ATV trail and MCCCT Trail are shown on the Timber Sale Map. Do not cut trees or damage posts with orange markers. Maintain a 20 foot wide slash, debris, and rut free zone daily using the MCCCT trail as the centerline. Do not run equipment down the MCCCT trail. Skidding across the trail or route may only occur in locations approved by the sale administrator.

5.2.41 - Snowmobile trail protection (9/11)

The snowmobile trail is shown on the Timber Sale Map. Do not cut or damage posts with orange trail markers or traffic control signs. If the trail is used, it must be maintained and restored to a condition equal to or better than before the sale. If the trail is used for hauling, it must be graded to the satisfaction of the Unit Manager or his/her representative prior to December 1st.

5.4 - Soil Protection

5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (1/09)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads and skid trails which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. The Unit Manager or his/her representative may restrict hauling and/or skidding if ruts exceed the specified depth. With the Unit Manager or his/her representative's approval, the Purchaser may return to the area when the risk of rutting has decreased.

7.2 - Extensions

7.2.2 - No extensions (3/09)

There will be no extensions granted on this contract. This sale is already scheduled for planting.

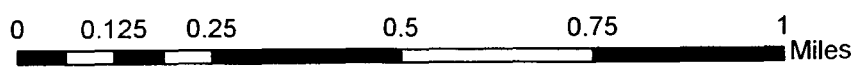

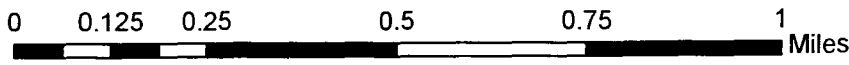

General Condition and Requirement 3.4 Damaged Timber, defines liquidated damages for undesignated live merchantable trees which are cut or injured. Damage to residual trees (defined as breaking of the cambium layer, broken tops or bending of trees from their natural position) is not acceptable.

No damage is acceptable to merchantable trees. Within the sale area, if more than 5% of trees (> 4.5" DBH) within a specified area of the sale are damaged, liquidated damages will be assessed for all trees damaged. Rates will be in accordance with General Condition and Requirement 3.4 Damaged Timber.

4 - Transportation

4.1 - Construction

4.1.3 - Slash and earthen piles (8/04)

Piles or windrows of earth along roads and landings that have been widened or constructed shall be leveled. Slash from road maintenance or construction, including stumps, shall be dispersed throughout the sale.

4.1.4 - Timber removed for construction (12/09)

5.4.1 - Rutting restriction, general (1/09)

Operations are to cease immediately if equipment and weather conditions result in rutting of roads and skid trails which is 12 inches or greater in depth and 50 feet in length. The Unit Manager or his/her representative may restrict hauling and/or skidding if ruts exceed the specified depth. 99 - Unique

99.1 - Timber Measurements Test (2/12)

There are special requirements for Payment Units (PUs) 1 and 2. The DNR is conducting a test comparing different methods of measuring trees and determining tree volume. PUs 1 and 2 contain test areas. Both test areas have 20 test plots, i.e. there is roughly one test plot per acre. "Cut" and "Leave" trees have been numbered at each plot. Certain "Cut" trees on each test plot must be felled and cut into product lengths when DNR staff is present. Additional cuts above the last pulp stick may also be required. DNR staff will then make detailed measurements of each tree. There are 90 measurement trees in PU 1 and 72 measurement trees in PU 2.

The test trees must be cut within 90 days of contract execution or as soon after July 15th, 2012 as is practical. The cutting of the test trees must occur in one period of time, for example, over a period of one or two weeks. A roundwood operation is required for the harvesting of the test trees. The cutting of these trees could be done independently of your normal harvest

activities. In other words, a faller could work with the DNR staff falling and bucking trees independently of the purchaser's normal harvest plan. If the wood from the test trees is not removed from the site, then advanced payment is not required. If the test trees are removed from the site, then PUs 1 and/or 2 must be paid in full or payment for the removed trees will be required within 30 days of scaling/billing. Plot locations and the list of measurement trees will be provided at the pre-work meeting. The DNR will work cooperatively to make this an efficient process with minimum impact to either party.

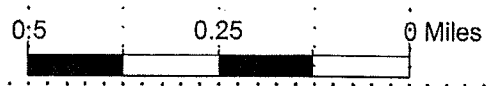
