Brook Trout

Species Description

Timber Lake is stocked annually with fall fingerling brook trout. This is the only trout species present. There is an ample forage base of various minnow species. Recent surveys have documented trout having good winter survival and robust populations with indiviudals reaching an excess of 18 inches in length being found.

Noteworthy

Timber Lake is a popular walk in lake for brook trout fishing and is undeveloped, having no camps or homes on it. Fishing modes include shore, kayak, canoe and float tube. The access trail is well traveled and fairly clear of obstructions.

Fishing Regulations

Timber Lake is a designated Type D trout lake. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Lake Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

Travel west on US Hwy 2 from the city of Iron River for about 10 miles until reaching a gravel road on your left (south), which is USFS 3905. There will be a brown sign indicating Timber Lake. Follow USFS 3905 to a gate with a parking area. This is the trail head to walk in to Timber Lake. The walk to the lake is approximately 1/2 a mile.
