Brook Trout; Steelhead

Species Description

Naturally reproducing populations of brook trout and steelhead are present here. The steelhead run in the spring is light but offers some diversity to the fisheries in this area. Brook trout range in size from six to ten inches, there are fewer large brook trout but there is the potential for some fish larger than ten inches.

Noteworthy

The entire stream is wadeable from the bridge upstream. The stream flows through a hardwood forest making tag alder cover limited, but providing excellent instream woody debris for fish cover. Anglers use spinners and natural bait on this stream. Floating is not an option as there are too many blow-downs hindering navigation.

Fishing Regulations

Roxybury Creek is a designated Type 1 trout stream. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in your current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

From Eckerman Corners (M-28 and M-123) drive north on M-123 towards Paradise for 11 miles to Lakeshore Drive (Curley Lewis Highway) and turn right (East). Follow Lakeshore Drive for about 5 miles to the bridge crossing on Roxbury creek. There is a paved parking lot on the right (South) side of the road.
