Species Description

Yearling steelhead are stocked into the Two Hearted River annually and also naturally reproduce in this system. The Two Hearted River is the premier river in the Eastern Upper Peninsula for steelhead fishing in the spring. Fish of ten pounds or more are frequently caught near the rivermouth. An occasional Brook Trout is caught through the summertime months, but the Two Hearted River is primarilly known for its steelhead and salmon runs.

Noteworthy

Wading in the Two Hearted River is extremely challenging due to the nature of the dark water and deep holes. There are plenty of bank angling opportunities at or near this site. The campground is a popular put-in for kaykers and canoeists. Typically steelhead can be caught here from early April through mid-May but the runs may vary from year to year. Brook trout are more prominent in this stretch of the river. Spawn bags for steelhead are most commonly used while spinners or worms are used to target brook trout.

Fishing Regulations

The Two Hearted River at the Reed and Green Campground is a designated Type 4 trout stream. Refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Stream Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

East of Deer Park, drive south on County Road (CR) 407 for about three miles to CR 410 and turn left (East). Continue on CR 410 for about 4.5 miles looking for the sign for Reed and Green Campground. Turn left onto CR 374 and follow the road for about a mile to the campground which will be on the right side of the road.
