Species Description

Yearling steelhead are stocked in the Two Hearted River annually and also reproduce naturally in this system. The Two Hearted River is the premier river in the Eastern Upper Peninsula for steelhead fishing in the spring. Fish of ten pounds or more are frequently caught near the rivermouth. An occasional brook trout is caught through the summertime months, but the Two Hearted River is primarily known for its steelhead and salmon runs.

Noteworthy

This site can be fished in a variety of different locations. Starting on the beach, anglers can fish the entire bank of the river with no obstructions all the way downstream to Lake Superior. Just upstream of the boating access site anglers can fish along the bank which skirts the dunes. Anglers primarily use spawn bags while some will use spinners. This is also a very popular take out location for anglers who choose to float from various locations upstream (Reed and Green campground or "the stairs").

Fishing Regulations

Directions to Site

East of Deer Park, drive south on County Road (CR) 407 for about three miles to CR 410 and turn left (east). Follow CR 410 for about seven miles until the road merges into CR 414. Continue on CR 414 for about two miles to CR 423 and turn left (north). Follow CR 423 until it ends at Rivermouth Campground.
