Fishing Regulations

The area of the Fox River at M-28 has split regulation types. Upstream from the M-28 bridge to the Fox River State Forest Campground, the Fox River is a designated a Gear Restricted (GR) trout stream. Downstream of the M-28 bridge, the Fox River is designated a Type 1 trout stream until its confluence with Dead Creek. Please refer to the Inland Trout and Salmon Regulations in the current Michigan Fishing Guide.

Directions to Site

From the intersection of M-28 and M-77 in Seney, travel west on M-28 for approximately 500 feet. Access the river by using the right-of-way along the road and bridge.
