Rainbow Trout

Species Description

The DNR annually stocks rainbow trout in Singer Lake. The fish are about six inches when they are stocked in the spring. By late summer-early fall, most trout are 10-12 inches. There is some carryover of trout to age 2, and fish up to 16 inches have been captured during DNR surveys.

Noteworthy

During July-early September, fish will be suspended in deep water. The exact depth will depend on water temperatures and oxygen levels, but 15 feet is a good starting point. Trout can be caught by still fishing with worms or corn. Trolling with spoons or spinners also is productive if you can keep the lure at the proper depth. The maximum boating speed on Singer Lake is 8 mph according to signs at the public access site. Access site is owned by Baroda Township. The site is on a paved road with paved parking. Parking is limited, especially for vehicles with trailers. The boat ramp is gravel.

Directions to Site

From the Shawnee Road/Snow Road intersection in the village of Berrien Springs: head west on Shawnee Road for 6.4 miles. Turn right (north) on Hills Road and drive 0.1 miles. Turn right (northeast) on Singer Lake Road. In 0.7 miles Singer Lake Road makes a sharp turn to the left. At this point, continue straight onto the road to the public access site.
