## Findings

5 1/2 <sup>M</sup>	Left premaxillary mostly naked-not healed-possibly a slight infection.
5 <b>1/2"</b>	Wound scar visible in membrane of lower jaw.
611	No mark of any kind.
6n	Wound scar at angle of jaw left side. (Right premaxillary almost completely severed from the head-wound fresh-apparently done in labeling).

Fish "caught with Barb Hook".

5 1/2 <sup>H</sup>	No mark of any kind.
5 3/4"	Wound scar visible in upper jaw.
5 <b>1/2</b> #	Left nostril abnormal possibly a hook mark since there is a soft soot in the bony region on the inside of the mouth

opposite the nostril.

Scar and slight abnormality in right upper jaw.

Left premaxillary torn from head except at anterior end. Wound healed.

Conclusion.—Fish in splendid condition. Possibilities of further infection as a result of hooking removed except in one fish. Number of fish not large enough to warrant a comparison of degree of injury by methods of catching.
