REPORT ON A SINGLE SPECIMEN OF YELLOW PICKEREL FROM SEGINAW, MICHIGAN

The fish was sent to the School of Forestry and Conservation and given to me by Dr. Earl O'Roke, Professor of Forest Zoology in the School.

State of preservation was very poor.

The fish was afflicted with Lymphocystis. The cause of the disease is unknown.

Fish with the same disease have been sent to us by Officer A. B. Asman (Report No. 37). A copy of that report can be prepared if called for.

The possibility of finding the cause and cure for the disease is probably as hopeless as for some of the common maladies of man. In order to make any progress in determining either the cause or cure it will be necessary to examina the living fish and maintain living ones in the aquarium.
