PAINT:							

- 1. Call Linda at (906) 875 6622, to make arrangements for paint.
- 2. Paint will be supplied from (location).
- 3. Contractor's work schedule must coincide with the DNR work schedule for paint supply.
- 4. The DNR will not be available on weekends or evenings.

DELIVERABLES:

- 1. A list of names that marked or cruised each payment unit.
- 2. A summary of paint used in quarts.
- 3. Tally summaries for each payment unit (one summary regardless of the number of markers) and all of the original tally sheets.
- 4. GPS files for any GPS work.

Brown Gate Contract

These stands are all very heavy in Basal Area and should be marked with consideration for equipment to operate. Where there are poles, the area should be marked to 70 BA. Where logs are present the marking should be to 80 to 90 BA. Some areas have less BA due to past thinning...some parts were not thinned. Concentrate on choosing crop trees and thinning around them, remove the two most competing trees if the crop tree is over 8 inches DBH. Thin around the smaller diameter crop trees ensuring 7 feet all the way around the crown of the crop tree. Block 1 must be accessed thru GMO. There is a short walk to get there from their road system. All other stands have private roads to them which must be left as good, or better, than before your use. Do not mark elm, oak, red or white pine, or cedar. If ash is marked the marking should be concentrated on the better log trees, leave the poorer quality logs and large overmature ash for seed trees. In Block 4, there are some openings. The largest opening has a red line paitned around it. The other smaller openings do not have lines painted but they have been GPS'ed to subtract their acreage. There is a little aspen in some of the openings, this aspen should be left and is not part of the hardwood stand. There are many grassy openings along the edge of these stands. We have permission to use the road systems in this area which are mostly private. The roads should be treated with caution and respect, both regarding other traffic and making sure not to litter or cause any disruption. These roads will be needed to access these stands to harvest.

Browns Gate Contract TIMBER SALE PRESCRIPTION APPENDIX

When establishing paint lines:

The attached type map delineates the contract marking area.

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When Registered Corners or Witness Trees are discovered:

- Any wooden posts encountered at corners must also be painted/protected.
- Bearing and/or witness trees discovered during the course of sale preparation must be protected. This can be accomplished by painting a ring completely around the tree at 4-6 feet above ground level with either red paint (corner surrounded by state lands) or blue paint (corner on private property boundary line). In addition, tying ribbon on these trees helps alert loggers to their presence. Do not mark any trees for harvest if cutting them is likely to result in damage to corner monuments and/or bearing trees.
- Please report the condition of all corners, posts and bearing trees to the Contract Administrator (CA).

When Cruising:

- Data must be recorded so volume can be determined by stand. If a stand is split into 2 or more payment units, each unit must be recorded separately. In addition, all data must be summarized by species or species grouping by payment unit
- All saw logs must be 100% tallied by species and diameter.
- Within all marked stands, cruise all marked pulpwood tree species that will yield one or more 100" pulpwood sticks with a minimum top diameter of four (4) inches DIB. Contact the Contract Administrator to see what grouping of pulpwood is acceptable.
- Within all marked stands, residual basal area (merchantable sized trees by species) at each plot must also be recorded on the cruise sheets. Plot centers must be marked according to contract specifications and correspond to a legible 1:15840 scale cruise map. Cruise specifications may be altered as necessary by the Contract Administrator.

When marking, prioritize selection of trees to be cut in the following order:

- 1. Release suitable crop trees. (Refer to $\underline{\text{The Complete Marker}}$ for crop tree specifications.)
- 2. When appropriate, try to increase the number of lesser occurring species. Maintain all species diversity. The Contract Administrator can provide an explanation of this priority.
- 3. Remove high-risk, poor quality and trees with poor crowns.
- 4. Maintain target basal area.

Reserved Species:

• Do not mark near any raptor nest trees. Report these to the Contract Administrator as soon as possible and directions will be given at that time.
