#### SPECIAL MARKING INSTRUCTIONS

If a stick nest is encountered see attached timber sale prescription Appendix. Do not mark in or near areas where Hemlock is present. Ask sale administrator for further information.

Unless otherwise specified, the tally sheets used must be those provided by the Forest, Mineral and Fire Management Unit.

#### RESTRICTIONS

- 1. Forest, Mineral and Fire Management Division must to be able to identify who did what on the timber sale.
- 2. The contractor may not have more than two markers in one payment unit without prior approval.
- 3. Each marker should have an assigned area to mark (not strips).

## PAINT

- 1. Call Greg Rekowski at (989) 983 4101, to make arrangements for paint.
- 2. Paint will be supplied from the Pigeon River Country Field Office.
- 3. Contractor's work schedule must coincide with the DNR work schedule for paint supply.
- 4. The DNR will not be available on weekends or evenings.

### DELIVERABLES

- 1. A list of names that marked or cruised each payment unit.
- 2. A summary of paint used (in quarts).
- 3. Tally summaries for each payment unit (one summary, regardless of the number of markers) and all of the original tally sheets.
- 4. GPS files for any GPS work.

# Pigeon River Country Management Unit Northern Hardwood Marking Little Mc-Chaffee Hardwoods Stand 78, Compartment 33

1. Access for marking these stands is shown on the attached map.

The attached type map delineates the contract marking area.

Avoid using dead or badly damaged trees – boundary trees must last for the duration of the timber sale (up to 3-4 years).

Avoid using small (fast-growing) stems and those exposed to direct sunlight.

Marking must be done in dry weather and when tree surfaces are not wet.

Paint the boundary line in such a way that it can be seen both from the inside of the sale area and when walking along the line from either direction (two sides).

Place marks approximately six feet above the base of the tree.

The contractor will keep track of total quarts of paint used by color.

The contractor will use a GPS unit to determine enclosed acreage to the nearest one-tenth acre, unless an alternative method is approved prior to work by Unit Management.

- Select crop trees. Crop trees are defined as trees which have the potential of making a grade one sawlog when
  they are harvested. A grade one sawlog is any tree capable of producing at least 16 feet of clear lumber. A
  crop tree can be ANY species of tree. Manage for the best tree in place at all times.
- 3. Locate 20-25 crop trees per acre spaced approximately 25-27 feet apart. In areas where 6" to 9" DBH trees predominate, the crop tree release will consist of creating a seven foot opening around the crown of the tree. This means that adjoining lesser quality dominants, co-dominants, and intermediates will have to be marked for removal. In areas where trees greater than 9" DBH predominate, the crop tree release will consist of removing the two nearest competitors from the dominant, co-dominant, and intermediate size classes.
- 4. After the crop tree has been selected and properly released, additional trees may have to be removed to reduce the basal area to the desired basal area. First remove high risk trees (esp. Eutypella canker) from the stand followed by trees from the sub-canopy around the crop tree. Lastly, remove any other lesser quality intermediate and co-dominant tree from the stand to reduce the basal area to the desired basal area.
- If pockets of advanced regeneration are found, these pockets should be released by removing surrounding trees.
- 6. Do not mark obvious den trees or trees of declining vigor which may serve as future den trees. Leave all aspen for future wildlife trees.
- Mark trees to cut on two opposite sides. Each tree marked to cut must be stump marked from the ground level
  to at least 6 inches above the ground in a moss free area. Paint must also be applied to tree surfaces that are
  dry.
- 8. Do not mark within 100' of any raptor nest trees. Report these to the Contract Administrator as soon as possible and directions will be given at that time.
- Marking of infrequently occurring species should be avoided. Consult the Contract Administrator for clarification.
- Do not mark in areas where Hemlock is present or predominate. See Contract Administrator for further instructions.
