Legal Description:

T31N, R1E, Sections 21, 28 and 33.

Identified Planning Goals:

Timber production, and successful regeneration of desirable species. Protection of landforms from ORV misuse.

Soil and topography:

The topography of the compartment is rolling to steep hills in the Northern and Southern portions of the compartment. The center portion is level low ground dominated by cedar swamp. The dominate cover types for the upland part of the compartment are hardwoods with oak and aspen. The East Branch of the Black River flows through the center of compartment.

Ownership Patterns, Development, and Land Use in and Around the Compartment:

The compartment boundary is state land throughout except on 40 acre of private. The compartment has a lot of antrim gas production development and use.

Unique Natural Features:

Some species may be present in and around the compartment.

Archeological, Historical, and Cultural Features:

None are known at this time.

Special Management Designations or Considerations:

A portion of the Green Swamp ERA is found in this compartment.

Watershed and Fisheries Considerations:

The East Branch of the Black River is a cold water stream.

Wildlife Habitat Considerations:

Mineral Resource and Development Concerns and/or Restrictions

The nearest active sand/gravel pit is located three miles to the southeast, and there appears to be sand & gravel potential in the compartment, but it could be difficult to avoid oil & gas infrastructure. This area has been developed for and is producing gas from the Antrim Shale. All State-owned mineral rights are currently leased and held by production. Due to the persistent low price of natural gas, there is unlikely to be any additional Antrim development in the compartment in the near future. There has been some past oil production from Guelph Formation reefs just over one mile to the southwest and the Central Charlton gas storage field is just beyond that. While there may be some potential for additional reefs beneath the compartment, the compartment is generally south of the main reef trend. No Guelph test wells have been drilled within the compartment, suggesting that no reefs have identified from existing seismic data. There is no known metallic mineral potential in this part of the state. The State does not own all the mineral rights within the compartment. Because the mineral estate is the dominant estate, reasonable access to the surface must be provided to private owners if they choose to explore or develop their mineral rights.

Vehicle Access:

This compartment is accessed from 3 main roads: Camp 8 Rd, Huff Rd and Co Rd 622. There are several two tracks for traversing the area.

Survey Needs:

None needed at this time.

Recreational Facilities and Opportunities:

There are many opportunities for mushroom picking, hunting, fishing and wildlife viewing in the area.

Fire Protection:

This compartment is located in the protection area of the Atlanta DNR and the Vienna Township VFD.







Stand Boundary Map


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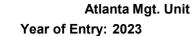
