## Legal Description:

T31N, R02E, Section 20, 29, and 32

#### **Identified Planning Goals:**

To provide for the protection, integrated management and responsible use of a healthy, productive, and undiminished forest resource base for the social, recreational, environmental, and economic benefit of the State of Michigan.

#### Soil and topography:

Soils are mostly sand and loamy sand complexes. Overall, the topography is rolling to steep. The dominant covertypes are Northern Hardwood, Oak, and Aspen. The compartment forest habitat types are mostly PArVHa, PArVVb, and AFO.

#### Ownership Patterns, Development, and Land Use in and Around the Compartment:

Complete State ownership except east half of section 32. Active Antrim gas wells exist throughout the compartment.

#### **Unique Natural Features:**

Occurences- Ram's Head Lady's Slipper Potential Occurences- Ram's Head Lady's Slipper and Eastern Massasauga Rattle Snake

#### Archeological, Historical, and Cultural Features:

There are known concerns within the compartment. All proposed management activities have taken these concerns into consideration.

## **Special Management Designations or Considerations:**

None.

## Watershed and Fisheries Considerations:

None.

## Wildlife Habitat Considerations:

The primary focus of wildlife habitat management will be to address the habitat requirements identified for the listed featured species which are found in this compartment. These species include elk, black bear, eastern Massasauga rattlesnake, ruffed grouse, wild turkey, and white-tailed deer. Based on the selected featured species, some of the most significant wildlife management issues in the management area are the maintenance of young forest; extensive mature forest; large open grassland complexes; the retention of large, over-mature trees and snags; and the maintenance and expansion of hard mast and mesic conifer components.

## Mineral Resource and Development Concerns and/or Restrictions

Surface sediments consist of coarse-textured glacial till and glacial outwash sand and gravel and postglacial alluvium. The glacial drift thickness varies between 400 and 600 feet. Beneath the glacial drift are the Devonian Berea Sandstone and Bedford and Antrim Shales. The Antrim is quarried for cement products elsewhere in the State. A gravel pit is located one mile to the southeast and potential is good. This area has been drilled and is producing gas from the Antrim Shale.

#### Vehicle Access:

Access is off Meaford road using existing two-tracks and trails. Most two-track access has been improved and is maintained by Antrim Gas activity. Illegal ORV activity in the compartment is found in many places.

#### **Survey Needs:**

None.

#### **Recreational Facilities and Opportunities:**

Deer and small game hunting, elk viewing, and mushrooming.


## **Fire Protection:**


Good response time being close (~10 min.) from the Atlanta field office. Difficult access in places with steep terrain and narrow two-tracks.
