Identified Planning Goals:

Planning goals would include forest management in timber types that will promote species diversity across the compartment. Both even age and uneven aged forest management will be nessary to obtain the management goals in this compartment.

Soil and topography:

Soils are loamy and of variable depth. Sandstone bedrock does occur within the upland portions of this compartment. The lowland portions of the compartment contain soils of various organics. The topography is fairly flat across the compartment.

Ownership Patterns, Development, and Land Use in and Around the Compartment:

This portion of state land is an isolated block that is surrounded by both industrial ownership and individual camp owners. Land use in and around the compartment consist of hunting, fishing, ORV & snowmobiling riding.

Unique Natural Features:

This compartment contains the Yellow Dog River along with a broad expanse of lowland conifer swamp.

Compartment 201 is found within the Huron Mountains Management Area; on a Bedrock-Controlled Ground Moraines and till-floored lake plains in northern Baraga and Marquette Counties. Most of the natural communities in this area are mesic northern forests and poor conifer swamps. Major forest cover types include Northern Hardwood, Aspen and Hemlock. The area receives significant snowfall and represents almost 20% of the WUP State Forest hemlock resource. This area provides critical wintering habitat for white tailed deer, especially along the Lake Superior shoreline. Additionally, some of the largest tracts of mature forest in the Great Lakes (e.g. McCormick Tract, Craig's Lake Wilderness State Park, and the Huron Mountain Club) occur within or adjacent to this management area. The current condition and spatial arrangement of these areas provide some of the best opportunities within the WUP, state, and Great Lakes for area sensitive wildlife that require large tracts of mature forest, mesic conifer or corridors between such areas. The wildlife priority here is to manage for old growth forest characteristics, in a fairly un-fragmented condition, with particular emphasis on protecting the hemlock component. This strategy will protect thermal cover, provide for wildlife movement corridors, and provide habitat for a variety of species. This includes minimizing habitat fragmentation; insuring adequate course woody debris; retain or develop large living and dead standing trees (for cavities); mesic conifer; mature forest; within-stand diversity; closed canopy forest; and deer wintering complexes.

The following have been identified as featured species for the Huron Mountains Management Area: American Marten, Blackburnian Warbler, and White-Tailed Deer.

Mineral Resource and Development Concerns and/or Restrictions

Active sand/gravel pits are located to the west of the compartment, and there is some sand potential within the compartment. The Jacobsville Sandstone may be near the surface in places. The Jacobsville used to be quarried for building/dimension stone, but there is not currently a significant economic value for the material. Active metallic mineral

production is occurring at Eagle Mine seven miles to the southwest. There has been little mineral exploration in this area and no history of mineral leasing, but metallic mineral potential is unknown. Any potential metallic mineral bearing formations here would be relatively deep. There is no known potential for economic hydrocarbon production in the UP. The state does not own all mineral rights within the compartment. Because the mineral estate is the dominant estate, reasonable access to the surface must be provided to private owners if they choose to explore or develop their mineral rights.

Vehicle Access:

Vehicle access is limited throughout the compartment due to the private ownerships that surround the State land.

Survey will be needed to accomplish the timber sale work within this YOE.






