Compartment specific changes made during the Compartment Review:

Compartment 007 (Stand Examiner – Greg Rekowski)

Stand 86 – Add clearcut with reserves. Use up to 10% retention to protect pockets of natural pine. Try to strategically place retention along the edges when practical. Leave any legacy size pine. Cut was discussed with the Pigeon River Country Advisory Council and they showed support and approval.

Stand 69 – Add monitoring treatment.

Stand 95 – Continue with monitoring treatment.

Stand 2 – Change treatment from seed tree to clearcut with retention.

Stand 79 – Add treatment, overstory removal.

Stands 47, NF76 & 79 – Add trail considerations.

Compartment 059 (Stand Examiner – Greg Rekowski)

Stand 51 – Add roller chop, trench and plant.
