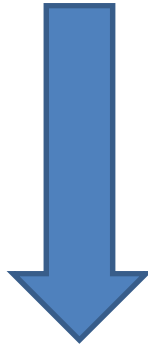


Applications should be mailed to your [local DNR office](#)

Issued by authority of Part 5, 1994 PA 451, as amended. Noncompliance with the provisions of this act may result in revocation of this permit.

This form is the application for personal use fuelwood. After approval, it will be attached to a Personal Use Fuelwood Permit and Receipt (PR4166). A permit is required to remove timber and must be in your possession when removing fuelwood from State land.

LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION

LIABILITY. Permittee hereby releases, waives, discharges, and covenants not to sue the State of Michigan, its departments, officers, employees, and agents, from any and all liability to Permittee, its officers, employees, and agents, for all losses, injury, death or damage, and any claims or demands thereto, on account of injury to person or property, or resulting in death of Permittee, its officers, employees or agents, in reference to the activities authorized by this permit.

INDEMNIFICATION. Permittee hereby covenants and agrees to indemnify and save harmless, the State of Michigan, its departments, officers, employees, and agents, from any and all claims and demands, for all loss, injury, death or damage, that any person or entity may have or make, in any manner, arising out of any occurrence related to (1) issuance of this permit; (2) the activities authorized by this permit; and (3) the use or occupancy of the premises which are the subject of this permit by the Permittee, its employees, contractors, or its authorized representatives.

I understand and agree with all permit requirements listed and absolve the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and its employees of any personal injury or property damage resulting from operations under this permit. Further, I understand once this application is approved and signed by the Director's authorized representative, it becomes a valid permit.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Complete and sign application.
2. All permits are \$20.
3. Make check payable to State of Michigan.
4. Return the completed application and check to the DNR office which manages the State Forest land where you wish to collect fuelwood. Addresses and office locations can be found at: www.michigan.gov/fuelwood.
5. General Area permits are for dead and downed wood on open State forest land, as shown on the map attached to your permit and may not be available at all locations. If you are interested in something different, contact your local DNR office about a Specific Area permit.
6. If approved, your application will be returned to you attached to a permit with a valid permit number.
7. The permit and application must be attached to be considered a valid permit and must be in your possession when collecting fuelwood.
8. Your permit serves as your receipt.

INFORMATION

1. A Personal Use Fuelwood Permit and Receipt (PR4166) must be obtained before cutting or removing any firewood (except for campfire wood used for personal and immediate use).
2. Collection of campfire wood is covered under a camper's State Forest Campground registration or under the dispersed Camp Registration Card (PR 3134).
3. Firewood removed under a Fuelwood Permit (PR4166) must be for personal use only and is not to be sold or traded.
4. The Fuelwood Permit (PR4166) is limited to one (1) per household per year and is non-transferable.
5. A signed Fuelwood Permit (PR4166) must be in the possession of the Permittee, and the Permittee must be on site when cutting or in the vehicle when transporting.
6. The Fuelwood Permit (PR4166) allows for the removal of up to five (5) standard cords of wood within 200' of a road. A standard cord of wood is a pile of wood with dimensions of 4'x 4'x 8'.
7. The Fuelwood Permit (PR4166) is issued during the period of April 1st to December 31st and will be good for up to 90 days, but not past December 31st.
