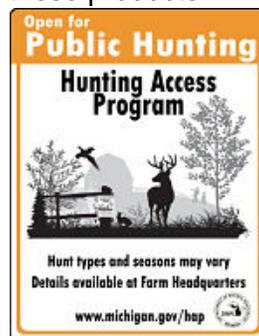

[Mi-HUNT](#) is the interactive online mapping tool created specifically to help Michigan hunters and outdoor enthusiasts find land details, use DNR resource information to review areas across Michigan, see State public hunting / trapping lands, cooperating private landowner lands like the Hunter Access Program or Commercial Forest lands, and much more. Within this application, there is an option to display HAP lands as a red star symbol representing those cooperator areas, so you can find the HAP areas already in [Mi-HUNT](#).
